Midland Rotarians have had a look at sample pages of a Bible to be distributed in the People's Republic Of China.

A visiting Rotarian from Bolivia who is both a member of the world executive of the United Bible Society, and executive secretary of the Bolivian Bible Society, joined the

Midland Rotarians at their weekly meeting.

The Bible Society has circulated Bibles in nearly 180 countries, in more than 1,862 languages. Among those countries are the USSR, Poland, and Cuba "with the official permission of Fidel Castro."

Bolivia is the most

revolutionary country in the world, Jaime Goytia said. Bolivia has had 180 presidents in its 152 years as a nation. Rotarians gasped when told that 12 Bolivian pesos were equal to one U.S. dollar two years ago, and that the exchange rate today is two million pesos to one U.S. dollar.

Bolivia's principal export of the past, tin, is not in demand on the world market. Bolivia's biggest export today is in great demand, but also illegal: cocaine. Colombians buy cacao leaves

and make cocaine, Goytia said. The use of cocaine by children and young people in Bolivia is a big problem, as is unemployment.

Excluding Haiti, the landlocked nation of Bolivia has become one of the poorest Latin American countries, Goytia said.

Four million of Bolivia's 6.5 million population speaks Spanish. The two other principal languages are Qheshua (Incan) and Aymar. Goytia had Bibles in both of those languages with him.

Ready for winter

Tay Township's public works department has a new piece of equipment: a \$114,000 with trade-in snowplow. The township has two older snowplows, and two trucks on which plows are mounted for snow removal.

New plow in Tay

Tay Township is ready for winter. Delivery has been taken of a new Champion 185 horsepower one-way blade snowplow.

The township owns three graders and two trucks on which snowplow blades are mounted in the winter. The new snowplow, with trade-in, cost \$114,000.

Present to receive the vehicle in the public works yard beside the township office were public works chairman Deputy-Reeve Tom O'Hara, Councillors Doug Rose and Lynn Morton, Clerk-Administrator Brian Hopkins, Public Works Superintendent Cec Gratrix, Road Foreman Don Kelly, and snowplow operator Don Hawke.

Representing Champion of Goderich was Ed Shewfelt. Champion is the only Canadian manufacturer of snowplows.

The new snowplow is different from the township's older plows. It is equipped with a one-way blade instead a V-shaped

blade. The plow is articulated - it bends in the middle - meaning that it can be maneuvered easier.

The plow will be used also on construction projects and for heavy duty maintenance of roads.
