many areas, in the interest of perpetuating remembrance, the poppy is distributed without expectation of donations, eg. to school children. All poppy material is manufactured by disabled veterans or their dependants and provide a source of income for them.

* * Average campaign expenses for 1543 branches participating in National campaigns is \$602 per branch.

***The distribution of funds is governed by the General By-laws of The Royal Canadian Legion. Some of their uses are:

Community medical appliances and medical research;

Day Care centres for adults, meals on wheels, transportation and related services.

Purchases for construction, reconstruction, maintenance, renewal, repair, furnishing or refurnishing of housing, accommodation or care facilities for elderly or disabled persons and their dependants.

Operation of Service Bureau which acts on behalf of veterans and their dependants to present their submissions to the Government, to secure assistance and pensions in accordance with existing programs.
