

All will be there to find out some new ways to cope with our massive waste problem.

That's what the Georgian Shore Waste Reduction Group is planning for this Saturday as it holds its first ever waste reduction seminar.

Guest speakers and videotapes will tell the story of recycling programs that work - and which can save towns like Midland and Penetang millions of dollars.

"Our ideas will be based on reality," said Peter Stubbins, one of the organizers. "It will not be totally hypothetical."

Among the ideas to surface at the seminar will be one appealing directly to industries: "Profits From Pollution," an audio-video show on how to save money and reduce waste. It's produced by Pollution Probe.

Stubbins will also draw upon his collection of waste-reduction video tapes for the seminar.
