1975 - Volunteer Attorney for the people of California to achieve a comprehensive health services program to provide Federally funded hospitals and help for the poor

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Tiny passed By-law No. 1-87 on the 4th day of November, 1987 under Section 34 of the Planning Act, 1983.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-law by filing with the Clerk of the Township of Tiny, not later than the 10th day of December, 1987, a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection.

EXPLANATORY NOTE By-law 1-87

Purpose and Effect:

By-law 1-87 amends comprehensive Zoning By-law 30-77 as amended to simply consolidate all of the approved zoning by-law amendments under By-law 30-77 for Concessions 1 to 7 inclusive and Lots 76 to 99 inclusive in Concessions 1 and 2 Old Survey.

The consolidation of the approved zoning is to provide for more detailed base maps thus facilitating the interpretation of the actual zones.

By-law 1-87 is deemed to conform to the Official Plan for the Township of Tiny.
