

Kings lose basics in loss to Oro

Penetanguishene Jr. C Kings drastically outshot Oro 77's Wednesday night 54-37, but lost the contest 11-6.

Penetang was outscored 4-2 in both the first and third periods and 3-2 in the middle frame.

Mike Barker and Marty Osbourne scored before the five minute mark to give the hosts a 2-0 lead. Wayne Desjardins replied for Penetang at 6:40 from Stu Restrup and Brent Dubeau on the power play with Ken Hughes off for holding. Roy Hildebrandt connected, assisted by Gilles Charlebois to knot the contest at 2-2 on another power play opportunity at 14:16 with Mike Lefave sitting out a charg-

ing infraction.

J.P. Latour scored at 16:08 and Jeff Lanoue banged in a rebound at 19:24 with a man advantage to give Oro a 4-2 lead. Penetang outshot Oro in the frame 22-15.

Latour registered an unassisted tally at the 1:03 mark of the second period only to have Hildebrandt reply for Penetang 45 seconds later on their third consecutive power play. Rick Rimkey scored a power play goal at 4:24 for a 6-3 lead, but Penetang came back again at 6:09 when Kelly Cousineau started the play with a pass to Mark Rankin who fed the puck to Brad Dennis for the Kings fourth tally. Steve Parsons gave Oro a

7-4 lead before the period ended. Penetang outshot their opponents once again 19-12.

Jeff Lanoue recorded his second of the game at 2:44 of the third to double the count on the visitors. Rankin responded with a man advantage at 11:40 only to have Parsons connect with his second of the contest 21 seconds later. John Frankom scored an unassisted marker at 14:55. Dubeau accounted for Penetang's final goal less than a minute later. Dana Forbes combined with Lefave and Osbourne on the power play at 16:59. Penetang outshot Oro in the period 13-10 and on the game 54-37.

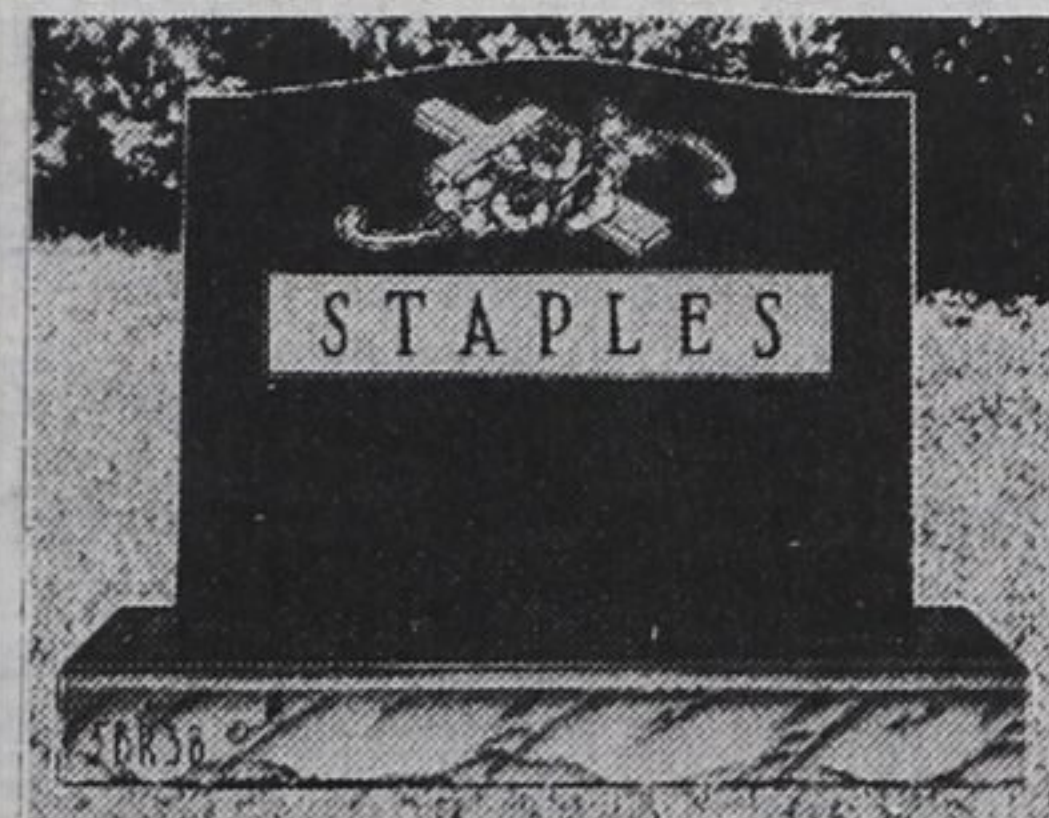
