Last meeting

The Huronia District Hospital capital campaign steering committee had its final meeting last Thursday. The campaign goal was \$2 million. As of Monday after-

noon, the total was \$2,115,000. Campaign chairman Robbert Hartog is optimistic that the cheques still being received will push the total to \$1.3 million.

HDH over the top!

The campaign to raise \$2 million from the community to buy equipment for, and expand, Huronia District Hospital, was a success. The campaign officially came to an end last Thursday with \$2,103,199 pledged.

Seven hundred and thirty-one donations were received as of noon last

Thursday. Campaign chairman Robbert Hartog said late donations could boost the total to \$2.3 million.

At the beginning of the campaign the hospital had \$500,000 in a reserve fund that will be added to the money raised through this year's fundraising campaign.

The professional fundraisers who worked with the board of directors and the volunteer fundraising committee, will be paid \$156,000. The \$156,000 comes out of the hospital's operating money, which is the money it receives from the provincial government. All of the money raised through the capital campaign will be spent on the hospital.

The HDH Auxiliary, medical staff, hospital staff, and members of the board and steering committee, have pledged \$442,982.

Major gifts (21), donations from corporations (41), and financial institutions (7), totalled \$1,351,250.

The campaign was aimed at everyone who uses the hospital. The fundraisers met with the executives of area cottage associations and targeted boaters and cottage owners. Boaters who were

asked to pledge \$1 per foot of boat for five years have pledged \$11,784. Cottage owners, asked to pledge \$1 per foot of shoreline, pledged \$46,280.

Every donor will receive a tax receipt. The donations have been arriving at the fundraising office faster than the receipts can be produced and mailed.



Bob Brush Charge may be resolved

The charge of threatening laid against Robert Brush of Midland might be resolved before his next court appearance, Brush's lawyer told Provincial Court Judge Donald Inch on Monday.

Brush, one of the three Ward 1 councillors, was charged by Midland town police on Nov. 29, following the receipt of a complaint from his father, Robert Brush Sr.

Brush did not appear in court on Nov. 9. He was in the intensive care unit of Huronia District Hospital with a suspected heart problem, the court was told.

Until recently Brush ran Brush Disposal for his father, his father said last week.

During the Nov. 23 council meeting Councillor Brush declared a pecuniary interest and left the council chamber. In his absence the council awarded the municipal garbage removal contract for the next three years to Brush Disposal.

Brush's lawyer said that she would be speaking with the Crown about the charge before Brush's next court date.
