Although Lesotho is a poor nation, Lister says the children he and Donna will teach will be among the more well-off.


Lister says he and his wife had to undergo strict testing before being selected by WUSC. "It's difficult to get in," he said.

"We were just traveling along, meeting people," Lister said. "It's an extremely interesting process."


