

MSS girls wins

For the past week John Faragher has been preparing his MSS Junior Girls basketball team to win the Georgian Bay Championship. Intense practices and

mental preparedness were part of his game plan. The girls were ready. After Wednesday's game was postponed by weather, the charged Lady Marauders travelled to Stayner in a sudden-death play off match. Led by Shari Jeffery's 19 points, MSS defeated Stayner 43-21.

On to Barrie pitted against two undefeated teams, Barrie Eastview and Park Street Orillia. The semi-final with Eastview (12-0) started slowly dominated by the ball-control of Sue Bolton of Eastview and the inside work of Jennifer Balabuk of MSS with six points and key rebo unds. Then the ball-handling of Brenda Kennedy and Aya Utahara overcame this press with outstanding passing and scoring opportunities on the way to a 25-24 lead at half. Strong help defence by Shari Jeffery and Julie Richardson created turn overs and constantly frustrated the Trojans from Park Street. With a 7-point lead going into the final few minutes, the support squad of Nicole Kerry, Lori and Nat went crazy at every turn as they could smell victory. The defence held as MSS won 47-41 and their second straight GBSSA title.
