Postal sub-station may cut into union jobs, says steward

A new post office sub-station which opened recently in the Mountainview Mall may cut into union jobs, says the shop steward of the Midland inside workers.

And Sophie Wlaiko also says the new mini-post office, operating out of the Super X drug store in the mall, might not be using the correct equipment to do the job.

"I haven't seen it yet but I don't know if they have the proper equipment," she said Wlaiko. If they don't, she said, then "by rights they really shouldn't be open."

A spokesperson for the

post office could not be reached for comment by deadline.

Wlaiko also said another sub-station will be opening soon right around the corner from Midland's post office. She said the new outlet on King Street will also be housed in a drug store.

All this contracting out of postal services to non-union, private enterprise worries the shop steward. Contacted by telephone at her home last week, she said the new outlets might take away jobs from unionized labor.

"It depends how much business they do," she said.

"But we may lose counter clerks. It may come to that."

She said an autumn strike by the inside

workers was fought on the issue of these sub-stations, and it angers the union to see Canada Post proceeding with its plans.
