More cable channels planned

Cable television subscribers who are benefiting now from better signal reception will have more channels from which to choose in September.

A 24 hour news channel, a 24 hour weather channel, a religious channel (Vision TV), and a youth channel, will be added in the coming months, all but the news channel September.


