Deasley speaks at PMHA

At the annual Penetanguishene Minor Hockey Banquet held last Sunday at the Penetang Arena, Paul Henry introduced the guest speaker.

Deasley referred to a classmate at Michigan who was signed to a professional baseball contract by one of the best teams in baseball, the Toronto Blue Jays, who have proven they have an eye for talent. The players name is Jim Abbott. The point Deasley made is that Abbott has only one arm. Abbott made his mind up he could do it and he did it with a major short coming.

Deasley reminded the players that they should always thank their parents for all their efforts on their offspring's account, keeping them in equipment and trucking them all around the countryside over the years, supporting their interest in the game.

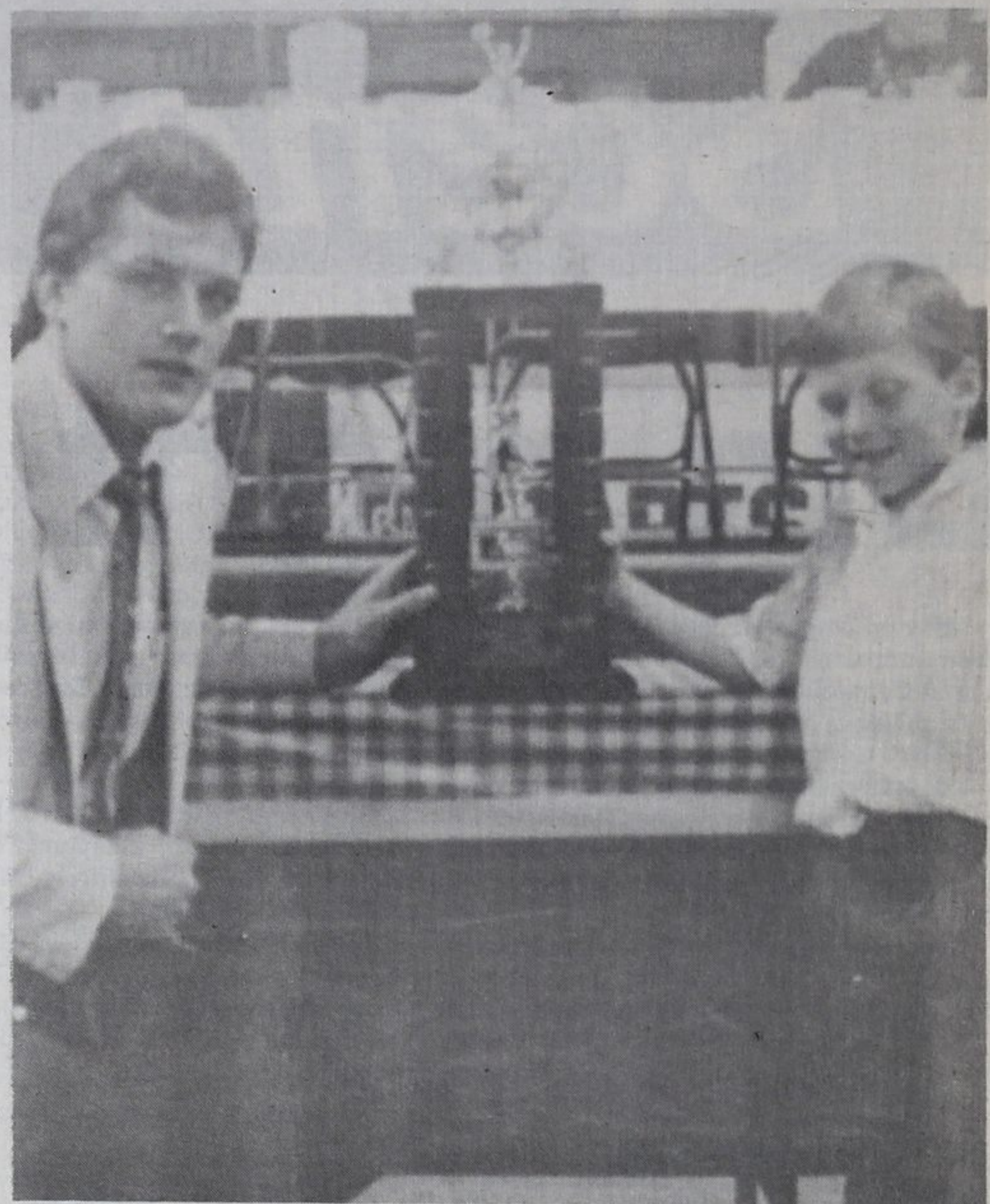
