Payment for parking in Penetang voluntary

The Penetanguishene-Tiny Chamber of Commerce this year has to trust in the kindness of strangers - and local people - who park overnight at the Penetanguishene town dock.

The Chamber is asking people with boat trailers

who park overnight voluntarily to pay \$5 for one night, \$20 for a week, or \$60 for a season.

The Chamber also plans, as another way to make some money, to tender for the Ontario motor vehicle licence franchise for the area.

Chamber President Anthony Lancia described the suggested rates as low for parking overnight. Launching is free.

Lancia suggested before the town council that it would be asked to pass a bylaw formalizing the parking fees if the volun-

tary system doesn't bring satisfactory results.

Lancia told the council last week that the Chamber has 95 members, or about the same number as in the previous year. A membership costs \$50.

The Chamber doesn't have any federally-paid summer students this year. Last year the Chamber office was staffed by three students. Money paid by boaters for parking privileges will help pay the cost of hiring staff for the Chamber's tourism promotion next year.

Lancia approached the council for money for 1988 because of the Chamber's financial problems.

"Without this influx of needed (federal) funding, the Tourist Information Centre will not be able to provide the tourist assistance and the subsequent beneficial economic impact for Penetanguishene. Frankly, there probably will be a staffed tourism information centre this year. We just do not have the financial capability."

The Chamber needs \$5,000 to \$6,000 to hire students in 1988.

John Turcotte told the town council that its approving plans of development brought before it is fine, but it should be correcting existing problems. Water pressure in Brule Heights has been low or non-existent for the two years he has lived there, he said. "I was lucky to get a bath today." He said he has had to replace elements in a water heater because of low water pressure.


Clerk Yvon Gagne said a breakdown had happened that very day. The clerk

said he didn't consider water pressure as great a problem as did Turcotte.

Turcotte told the clerk he took that position because he works for the council. "When I take my shower, that doesn't help," Gagne replied.

Water and Light Commission member Jim Martin, sitting in the audience, said that water pressure is "relative."

Turcotte was referred to the Water and Light Commission by the council. The Commission is responsible for delivery of water in the town, not the town council, the council told Turcotte.
