## Galoshiels rugby team wins pair

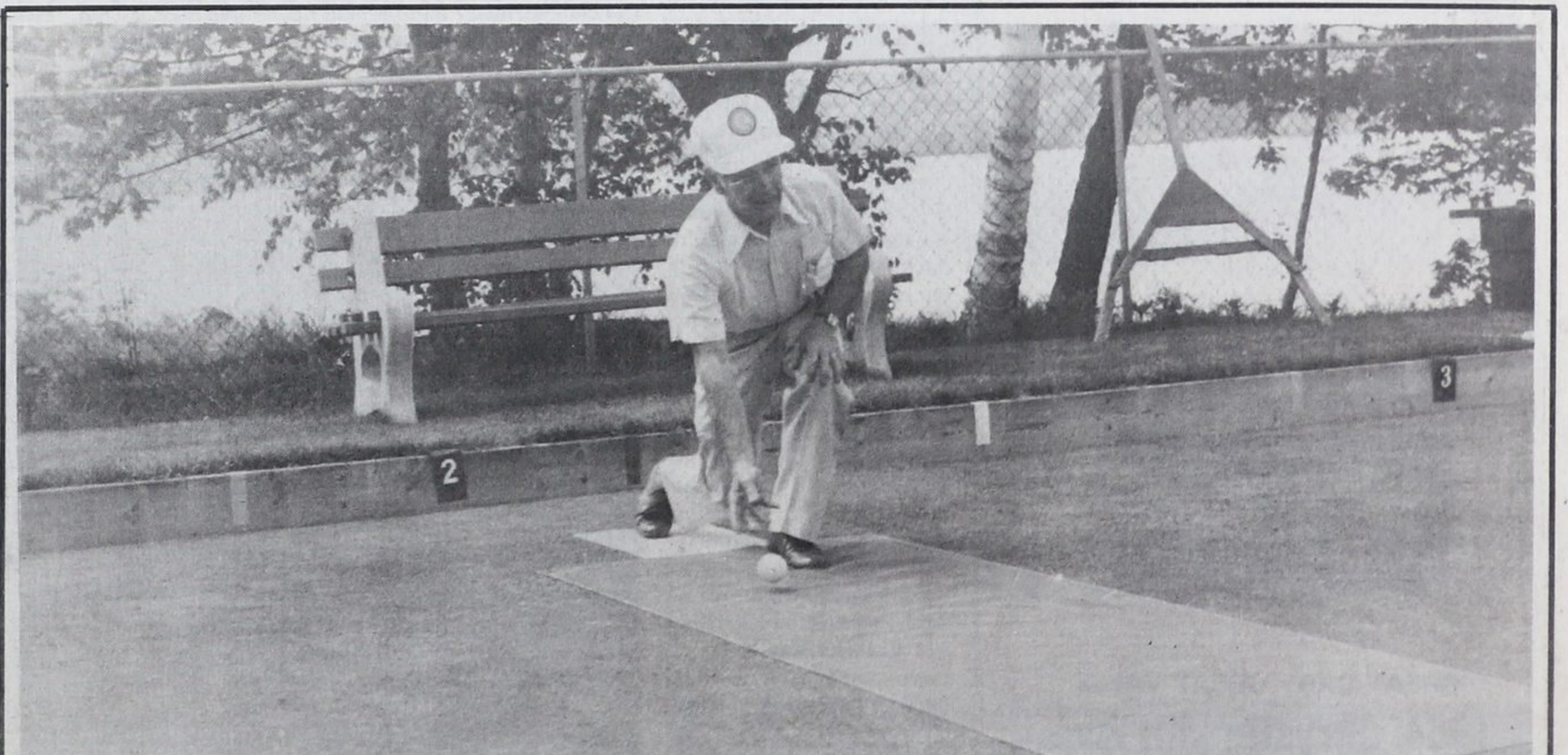
Galoshiels Academy rugby team of Scotland were guests of Midland Secondary School last week.
