

Fish hunt coming

The Sixth Annual Budweiser-Penetanguishene Rotary Fish Hunt will run this year from Friday, July 1 to Saturday, July 30 with the last weigh-in scheduled for 8 p.m.

The \$6,000 in prize money will be awarded at a dance held at the Penetang Curling Club following the weigh-in.

First prize of \$1,500 will be awarded for the largest smallmouth bass, largemouth bass and pike, while \$500 will be awarded for the second largest in each of those categories.

Several other prizes will also be awarded at the dance. The winners must be in attendance and they will have five minutes to claim their prize.

One of the six cash prize winners, chosen by elimination, will become eligible to enter the Labatt's National Fish Hunt Elimination Draw held in Magog, Quebec on September 30 - October 2.

All registrants, who enter a fish that day, are eligible for a daily draw prize of approximately \$100 retail value. Daily

winners of the largest fish in each day's category and the previous two days (regardless of category) will receive a rod and reel valued at \$125. The minimum size for smallmouth and largemouth bass will be 12 inches while pike is set at 28 inches.

Entry deadline is July 4.

A tenth place start position and a seventh place position after the first lap of the second race of the Becker-Canon Series held during the Rothman's 200 at Mosport this past weekend, ended in disappointment for local race car driver Gunter Schmidt.

"There were two qualifying races on Friday and one on Saturday and the car ran well in both," said Schmidt. "Just as I started the second lap a small piece of rubber was sucked in through an air jet and lodged in the carburetor," he said.

Local sponsor Ron Hunt, Marketing Services Manager of Waltec Sinkware, was attending the race with his family, wife Mary, son Eddie (11) and twin daughters Grace and Lindsay (8). He could hear the engine missing as Schmidt passed by his viewing position.

"Gunter had a great start passing three cars on that

first lap," reported Hunt. "Then suddenly he began to slow. I could hear the engine missing as he passed by. We sponsored Gunter because we know he's a champion. He sure proved it this weekend. While others were throwing their helmets because of their bad luck, Gunter quietly accepted that this is part of racing. I was proud of our association with him."

"It is part of racing," said Schmidt. "You want to do especially well when a sponsor attends the race. You prepare as much as

possible but how can you prepare against a piece of dirt being sucked into a carburetor.

Schmidt will race both his Formula Ford and his Volkswagen Fox in the President Trophy Race to be held at Mosport July 1-3.

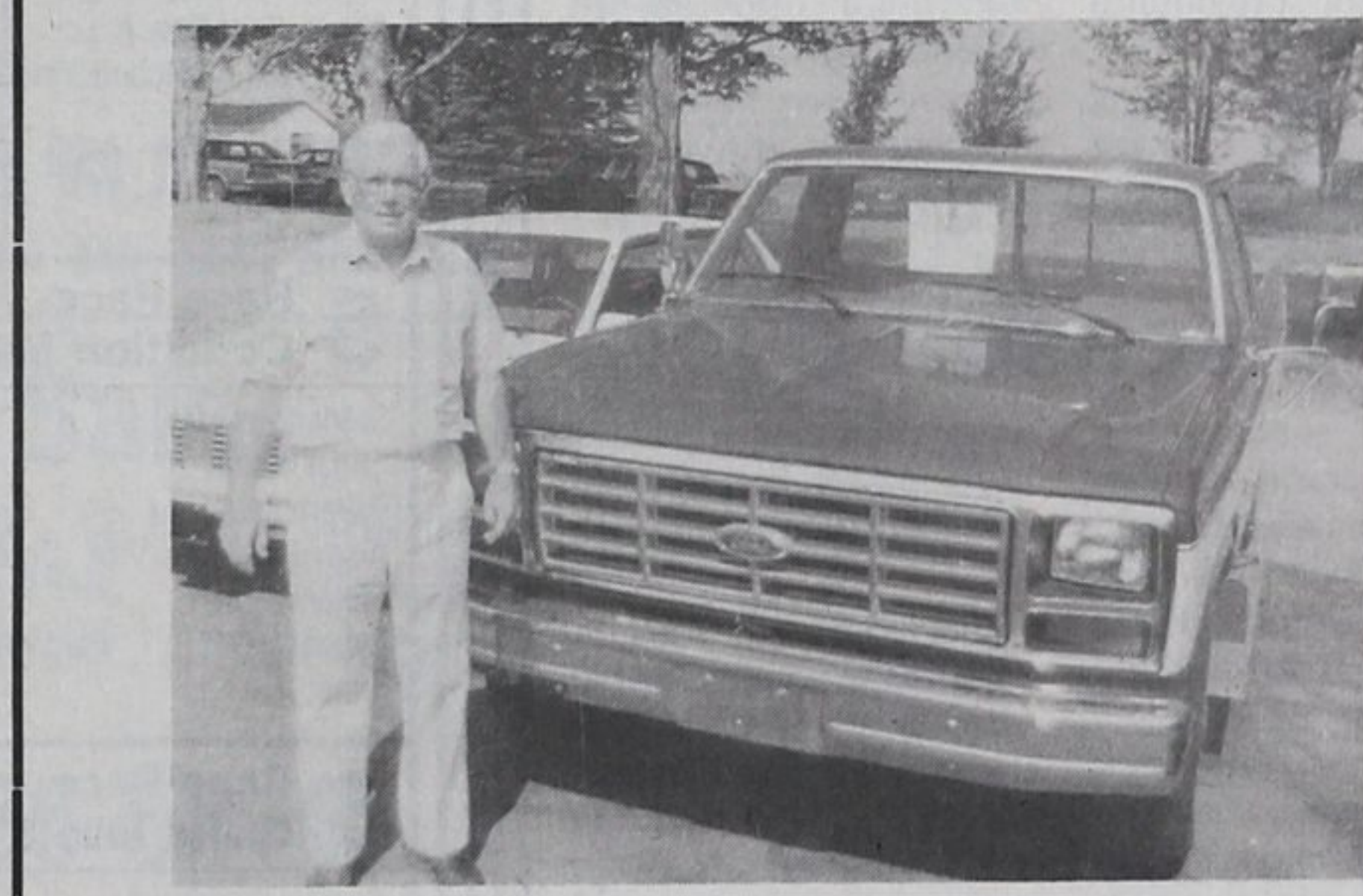
Action At Mosport

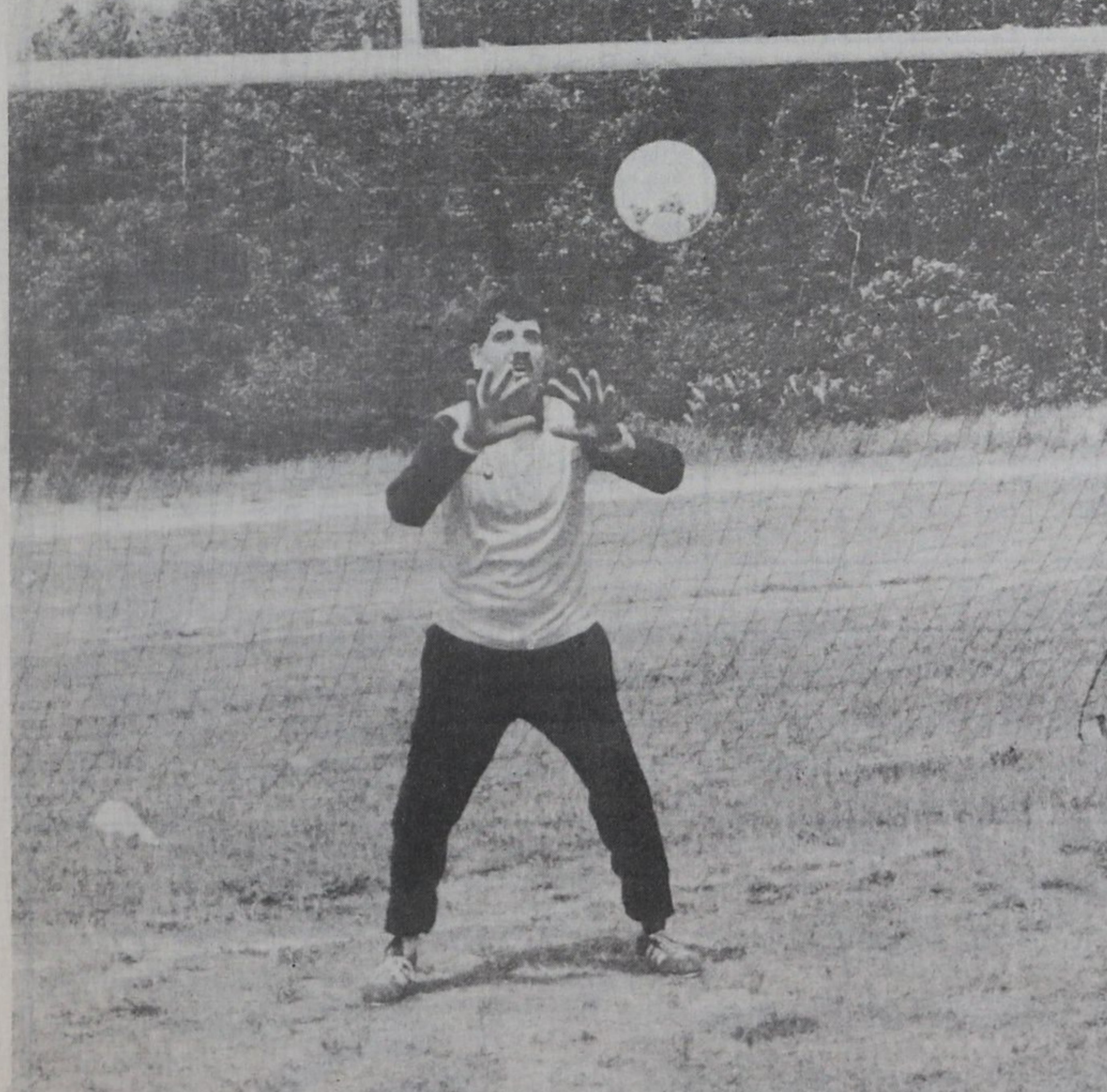
