sive private collection amassed by Robert Cut-

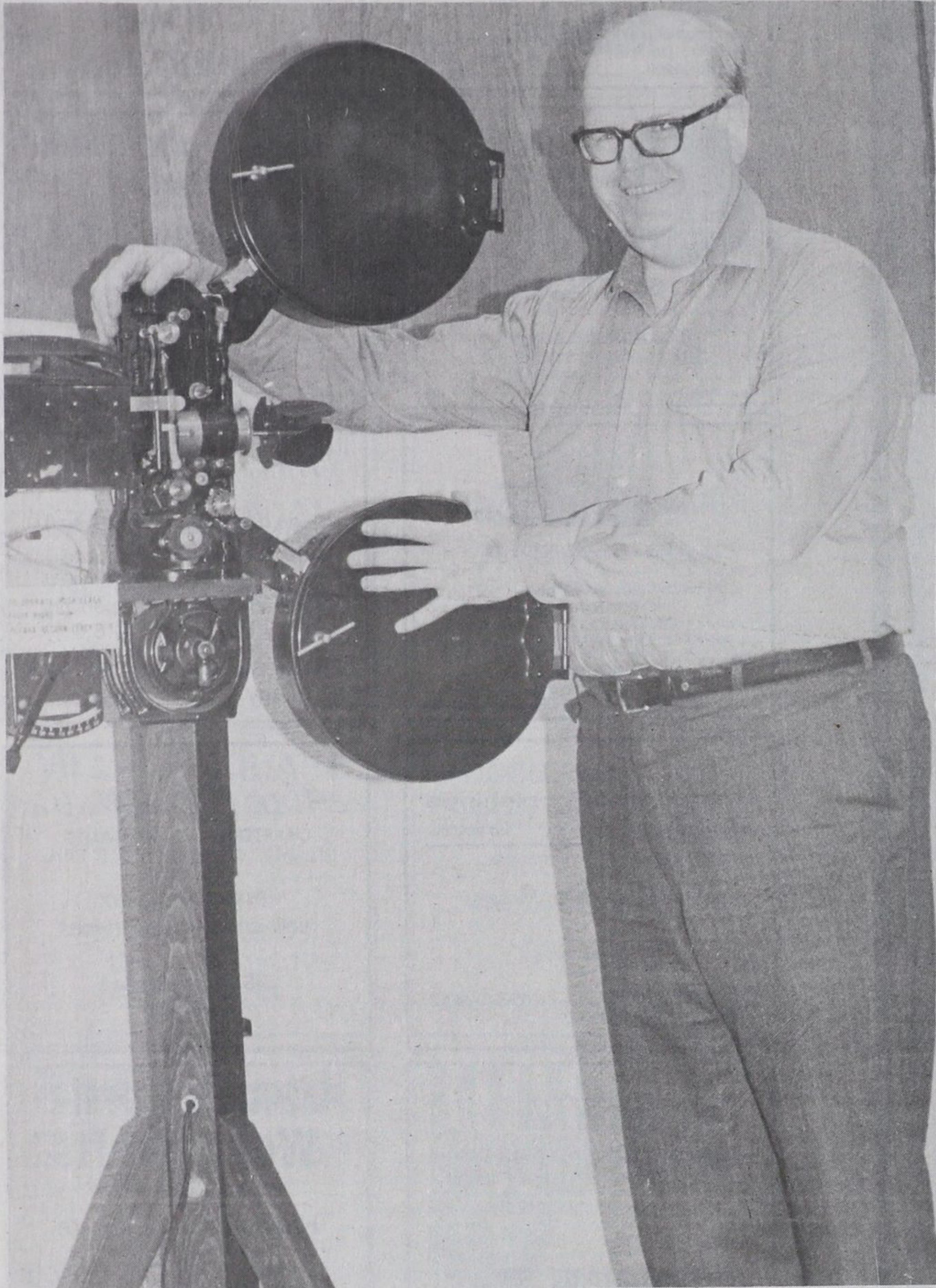
teridge of Thornton. Gutteridge's goal is a permanent home for the collection. He is looking in

Real to Reel is a survey of the technical development of motion pictures from 1860 to 1985. Arranged in Huronia Museum are examples of working Victorian optical toys; a peep show costing five cents offering the choice of Mickey

Mouse, two westerns, and Our Gang; early magic lanterns; an amateur cinematography display; early cinema posters; sheet music; and more.

The Canadian Museum of Cinematography accepts all "junk" equipment as well as working machines. Spare parts are always needed.
