

Town, an animated town attached to Hollywood circa 1947, in the film Who Framed Roger Rabbit? It seems Roger just can't

concentrate on his lines; his mind is always elsewhere (someone is fooling around with his wife). The silly animal decides

to hire Gumshoe Eddy Valian (a poor man's Philip Marlow) to get the goods on Mrs. Rabbit. Eddy gets on the case, but soon finds himself in the middle of murder, blackmail and other assorted mayhem.

With the movie Who Framed Roger Rabbit?, Amblin' Studios (which brought you the magic of E.T.) returns with a Steven Spielberg production based on the book, Who Censored Roger Rabbit? In any previous period of film history this film could not have been made, but

thanks to I.L.M. Productions (Industrial Light and Magic), the magic of live actors and animated charactors sharing the same stage becomes reality. The film is fascinating to watch, seeing the new technology at work. But the story is a 1940s detective pot boiler with Bob Hoskins as an overweight Humphrey Bogart. PG.
