One man, 3 votes in county democracy

Unless 104 voters turn up before the Nov. 14 election, Midland will have one representative with three votes on Simcoe County council

Midland is credited with 9,646 electors. It needs at least 9,750 voters to gain a second representative and a fourth vote.

The membership of the county council has been revised to keep the number of members from rising to an unmanageable number. Member municipalities with increasing populations were getting more members on the council.

Revision of the voting list before the last municipal election resulted in 50 additional names.

At the last Port McNicoll council meeting that village's reeve, John Moreau, said the new system was unfair to smaller municipalities. He noted that the current Simcoe County warden, Ken Knox, won his post with fewer individuals supporting him than the second place person, whose supporters carried more weight than Knox's.

Tax money not paying for trash

The tipping fee starting Oct. 1 at the garbage transfer site means Mitsubishi would pay an additional \$77,000 a year to get rid of the garbage it

Officials at the company Midland councillor Bob last Friday were unaware Brush is leading a drive to that their company will have to pay the new charge, although they had a meeting earlier this month with North Simcoe Management Waste Association representatives.

They believed that the \$775,000 a year in tax their company pays the Town of Midland covered waste disposal.

Starting Oct. 1, truck vincial government's role drivers bringing industrial

and commercial garbage to the garbage transfer site will be charged either \$77 a tonne for garbage with recyclable material removed or \$100 a tonne for unsorted garbage. The two charges are designed to encourage recycling. The tipping charges will be passed for payment by the haulers to their customers.

Garbage removal is the only municipal service the color television picture tube manufacturer receives for its \$775,000 a year in municipal tax, vice president Mike Colliver said. The company pays a contractor to carry 14 tonnes a week to the garbage transfer site.
