

Tay and Victoria Harbour working on railroad lots

Both Tay Township and the Village of Victoria Harbour have dealt recently with problems of lots near railroad lines.

In Tay, Dave Wilkins applied for a rezoning to residential to create three building lots fronting onto

Park Street.

At the public hearing Wes Crown, planning director for Tay, reported that the CN requested for the property "that a cautionary clause be placed in all agreements of purchase and sale regarding the pro-

ximity to its rail lines." This would presumably free CN from having to consider future complaints from the new owners

Lawrence Horton applied to Victoria Harbour's committee of adjustment Aug. 17 to sever a lot from

his property on William Street for a house.

Since this property abuts the CN lines, the subject was addressed again.

Brian MacKell, secretary to the committee, described requirements on another site to keep the noise down: a small hill topped by a fence and fronted by evergreen trees and rubber between the foundation blocks and the upper part of the house.

Joel Brousseau suggested the railroad might be gone in 10 years. In that case, suggested MacKell, it would be wise to build close to William Street. There was sufficient land at the back to sever again should the tracks become a road.

Bryan Larmand was amused at the suggestion that the tracks might be removed. "You are much more optimistic than I am. I don't think they'll be gone in my lifetime."
