### Brooklea holds slim lead

ed base hits scoring Cook, Weatherell and Counahan. A pair of infield outs ended the inning.

The fifth inning came and went without incident, but the sixth showed signs of a possible eruption. With one out, Clark and Clifford reached on base hits but were left stranded on two more infield outs.

Dial-A-Movie registered the last two counters in the final frame as Powell reached first on a base hit but was thrown out at second on Cook's fielder's choice. Wetherell was safe on the shortstop's error. Both runners scored on another miscue to the third baseman with two out.
