Changes to school board bring town more autonomy

Trustees responsible only to Midland electors will be elected to the two county boards of education in November.

A change of the Simcoe County Board of Education ward boundaries has split Midland from the old grouping of Midland, Tay Township, Port McNicoll and Victoria Harbour. Penetanguishene, Coldwater and Matchedash have been added in Midland's place.

Separate school supporters living in Tay Township, Midland, Port McNicoll and Victoria Harbour in the 1985 elec-

tion together had one trustee at the Simcoe County Board of Education.

Because Midland will now have its own separate school board trustee, Tay Township, Port McNicoll and Victoria Harbour will be joined with Georgian Bay Township, Matchedash, Coldwater and Medonte Township.

RR 1 Midland resident Roy Edwards represents Tay Township, Midland, Victoria Harbour and Port McNicoll now on the public school board. He intends to run again in the ward now comprised of Tay Township, Port

McNicoll and Victoria Harbour, Penetanguishene, Coldwater and Matchedash.

Edwards has been a member of a school board continuously since 1949. He was an original member of the SCBE in 1969, and is one of its former chairpersons. Between 1969 and 1949 he was a member of the Medonte Township area school board.

Penetanguishene and Tiny Township public school supporters currently are represented by Joan Jensen, the SCBE's chairperson.

Tiny Township will be joined with Wasaga Beach, Elmvalle and Flos Township, now joined with Wasaga Beach and represented by Wendy Mackenzie, will be joined with Vespra Township.
