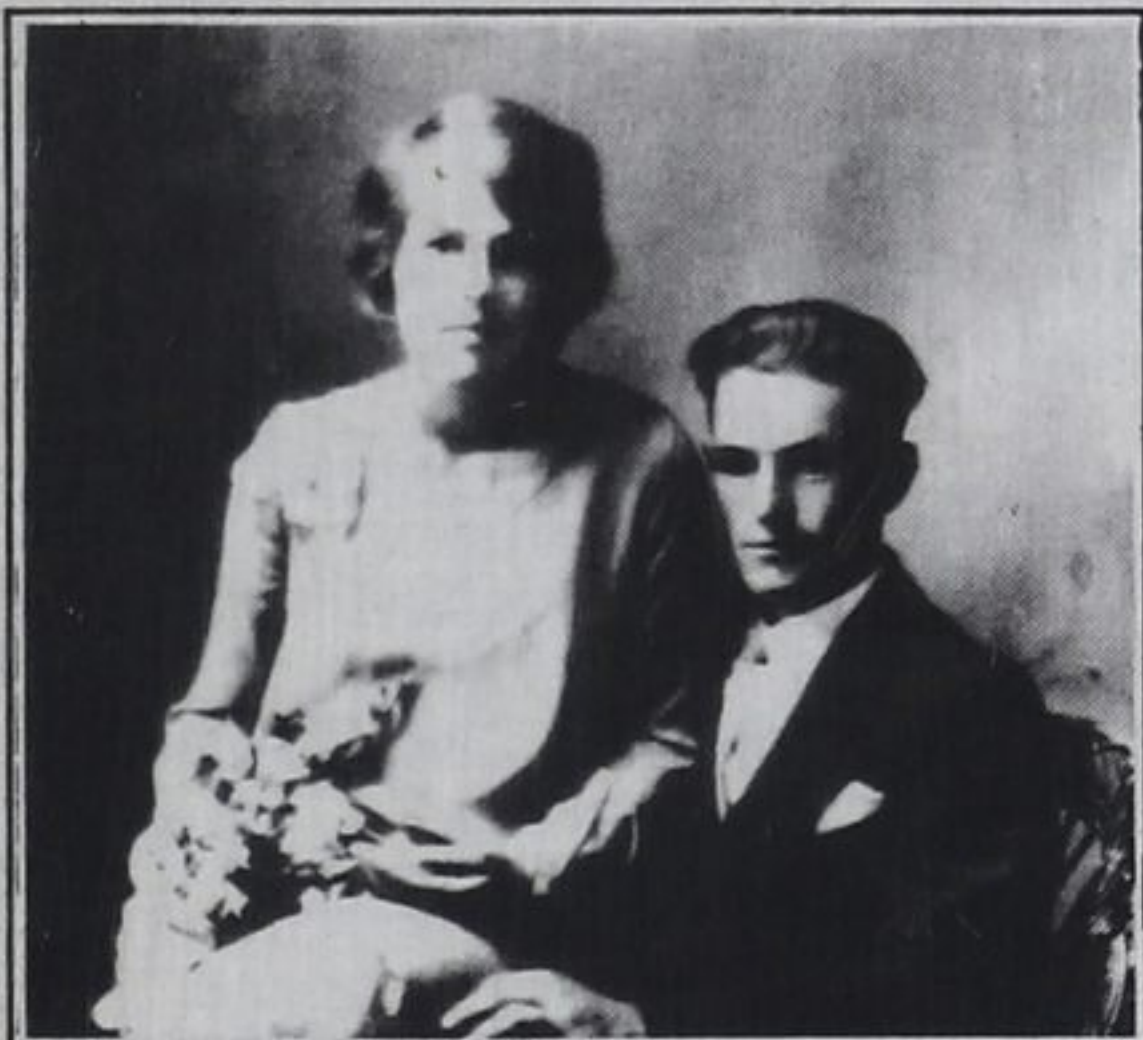

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Proposed Official Plan Amendment intends to establish new severance policies concerning the creation of residential lots and lots to be used for intensive or specialized agricultural uses in areas designated 'Rural' in the Township's Official Plan. New residential lots within this designation would be restricted to non-agricultural lands, separated by at least 1000' from existing agriculturally related buildings, not located in areas of high aggregate potential and generally limited to woodland areas. New residential lots would be limited to between 20,000 square feet and 38,000 square feet in size and, subject to the policies outlined above, no more than 1 residential lot could be created by Consent from a lot as it existed at the time of approval of the Township's Official Plan being May 31, 1976. New lots created for intensive or specialized agricultural users would require an Amendment to the Official Plan and would be required to comply with the policies of the Plan to ensure that the lot is used for agricultural purposes and not primarily for residential uses. In addition to the foregoing, a number fundamental policy concerns have been raised in connection with the proposed Amendment and will be considered by the Board. Particulars of these concerns are available for review at the Municipal Office during regular office hours.

EXPLANATORY NOTE BY-LAW 78-88

PURPOSE AND EFFORT:
By-law 78-88 amends comprehensive Zoning By-law 30-77 as amended to delete all references to the previous zoning schedules and replace those references with the numbering of the new schedules as adopted by Council under Zoning By-law 1-87, 2-87 and 3-87.

The modification relating to the reference to the land use schedules are considered to be housekeeping and therefore are deemed by Council to be of a minor nature not changing the intent of the By-law. No public notice or hearing was required.

The deletion taking place is reference to "Schedule 'A'" - Zone Maps comprised of the Index Map and Key Maps 1, to 31" and replacing with the following:

- "Schedule 'A', Map", Map A"
- and Schedule "A-1, Map A1," to
- Schedule "A-18, Map A18" inclusive:
- Schedule "A, Map B"
- and Schedule "A-1, Map B1," to
- Schedule "A-21, Map B21", inclusive and
- Schedule "A, Map C"
- and Schedule "A-1, Map C1," to
- Schedule "A-36, Map C36 inclusive."

By-law 78-88 is deemed to conform to the Official Plan for the Township of Tiny. 76
