As election nears

Councillors make last minute points

Viewers of the final Midland town council meeting (last Monday's) that Maclean Hunter Cable TV will broadcast before the Nov. 11 election saw a number of council members try to score points:

Councillor Robert Brush said he hopes to be one of Midland's representatives on the North Simcoe Waste Management Association if he is re-elected;

Mayor Al Roach volunteered to send a letter to the town's industries to explain why they are being charged by the tonne for garbage starting Oct. 1;

Councillor Gail Barrie reported that the number of questions received during a phone-in program on Cable 6 was greater than expected. People with questions can call her at home or call recycling manager Liz Downer, she said;

Councillor Fred Pilon presented a petition requesting a new sidewalk

signed by 64 residents of Hanly Street. A child who came close to injury was the reason for the petition, he said;

Reeve Bev Day announced that Midland will have one representative on the 1989 Simcoe County council. The town's next reeve will have three votes.

He then revealed his dec-

sion to run for deputy reeve;

Mayor Roach repeated his concern about young people hanging around the intersection of King Street and Bay Street. He called on the parks board to organize a Teen Town-type of attraction in the Civic Centre;

Deputy Reeve Nancy

Keefe announced that Telecare has a new "friendship" line for the use of children who are home from school alone before their parents arrive;

And Councillor Brush brought attention to a committee report item which, he said, showed that the town saved money by hiring a part-time instead of a full-time planner.

Skateboarders can roll

Bylaw doesn't work

A bylaw banning skateboarding is unenforceable, Midland's public safety committee has acknowledged.

A recommendation to rescind the bylaw will be received at the Oct. 24 Midland council meeting.

Five teenage skateboarders were urged by the public safety committee to organize the same way snowmobilers, and police themselves, have.

"It's just as easy to put (the ban) back as it is to rescind it tonight," Police Chief Ernie Bates warned them.

Older teenagers will have to take responsibility for younger skateboarders, the delegation was told.

"Little old ladies like

myself, someone whistles up behind them and scares the bejabbers out of them," said Deputy Reeve Nancy Keefe said. "That's not part of the game."

Not everyone plays hockey or figure skates, said Mayor Al Roach. Skateboarders have as much right to use the town's parks as anyone, he said.

The ban is unenforceable

in part because the Young Offenders Act doesn't allow police to charge a person under 12. Cancelling the ban will put the responsibility for skateboarding children back on parents, Bates said.

The popularity of skateboarding rises and falls in cycles, Bates said. He compared it to the hula hoop.

Ross will appear

Tay Township resident and former Midland councillor Ian Ross, 47, appeared in Penetanguishene Provincial Court last Thursday. He will be back

again on Oct. 27 to set a trial date.

Ross is charged with theft over \$1,000.

Ross was a town councillor from 1981 to 1985.

NOMINATIONS TOWNSHIP OF TINY

Notice is hereby given to the Municipal Electors of the Township of Tiny in the County of Simcoe that the period during which nomination papers may be filed in the office of the Clerk for the purpose of municipal elections will commence on the 13th day of October at the hour of 9:00 o'clock, and close on the 17th day of October at the hour of 5:00 o'clock, for the purpose of nominating fit and proper persons for the office(s) of Reeve, Deputy-Reeve, members of Council, members of the Simcoe County Board of Education (English) of which all Electors are hereby required to take notice that the manner in which said nominations shall be filed is set forth in section 36 of the Municipal Elections Act which provides that:

HOW NOMINATED:

(1) A person may be nominated as a candidate for an office by filing, either personally or through his agent, in the office of the Clerk, on the days and during the hours specified in subsection 35 (2), a nomination paper in prescribed form which,

(a) shall be signed by at least ten electors whose names are entered on the preliminary list of electors or who have made application to have their names included on the list and who are entitled to vote in the election to such office;

(b) shall state the name and address of the person nominated in such manner as will identify him and the office for which he is nominated; and

(c) shall state the name and address of each elector signing the nomination paper and, where the office for which the person is nominated is a member of a school board, that such nominator is a public school elector English or a separate school elector English, as the fact is. RSO 1980, c. 308, s. 36 (1);

(1a) The address referred to in clauses (1) (b) and (c) shall be the address within the municipality of the person nominated or the elector signing the nomination paper, as the case may be. 1982, c. 37, s. 5

CONSENT AND DECLARATION TO BE FILED:

(2) No nomination is valid unless there is filed with the nomination paper a consent in writing to the nomination and a declaration of qualification in the prescribed form by the person nominated.

PUBLIC SCHOOL NOMINATORS:

(3) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by public school electors shall be signed by public school electors "English" only.

SEPARATE SCHOOL NOMINATORS:

(4) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by separate school electors shall be signed by separate school electors "English" only.

SEPARATE NOMINATION PAPERS:

(5) Each person to be nominated for election to an office shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper, but an elector may sign more than one nomination paper for the same person and the nomination papers of more than one person.

(6) After a nomination paper is certified by the Clerk, it shall remain in the possession of the clerk, but shall be open to inspection by any person during the normal office hours of the clerk.

(7) The onus is on the person nominated for election to an office to file a bona fide nomination paper. 1977, c. 62, s. 36 (7)

If a greater number of candidates than required to fill the said offices are nominated and make the required declaration, notice of the time for the holding of the poll, including the advance poll and notice of the last day for making applications for a certificate to vote by proxy will be given forthwith.
