

## Parts and service is second to none

The 1989 model year marks the first year that Toyota Canada Inc. will sell Canadian-built cars as well as Toyotas from Japan.

Maintaining the traditional quality standards of vehicles made in Japan, the Camrys built in Kentucky and Corollas built in Cambridge, Ontario, will emphasize Toyota's commitment to the North American marketplace.

It all began in 1965 when the first cars were imported and on April 30, 1988, Toyota Canada Inc. recorded its millionth sale.
