## Two charged with taking the splake

Two area men charged with taking Georgian Bay splake out of season will appear in Penetanguishene Provincial Court on Dec. 7.

Charged on Oct. 18 with unlawfully selling and transporting splake were Tim Monague, 31, of Christian Island, and Ray Parkes, 28, of Tiny Township.

About half of the 260 to 270 charges against the two men had been processed by Monday. The men are charged with breaking Ontario fishery regulations under the Canada Fisheries Act, and provisions of the Game and Fish Act.

Legally taken splake sells for \$1.50 to \$2 a pound, Tim Boyd, Huronia District's enforcement officer, said on Monday.

He estimated that illegally taken splake - splake in excess of a fisherman's quota - might sell for \$1.50

a pound. MNR officials believe thousands of pounds of fish have been taken illegally from the Christian Island end of Georgian Bay.

The 11-month-old investigation is continuing. The investigators are looking for the buyers of the alleged illegally taken fish.

Four search warrants executed against suspected buyers in the Midland and Penetanguishene area on

Oct. 18 did not result in charges.

Eight of the 15 commercial fishing licences held by residents of Christian Island are being investigated.

The splake season ended on Sept. 30. This is the spawning season. Splake, a cross of the speckled trout and lake trout, was put into Georgian Bay around 1973.

## Fines promised

People who dump their garbage in Midland will be charged if caught, the town's bylaw officer says. A maximum fine upon conviction of \$2,000 is possible.

Robert Marchand reported episodes of five bags of garbage left dumped and broken open

around a downtown dumpster, two mattresses abandoned in a downtown alley, and a worthless couch left at the Salvation Army.

Considering the size of the town, the problem is not as great as it could be, Marchand said.
