## MSS crashes to defeat

The Midland Secondary School Senior Football team was blanked 34-0 Friday afternoon by Collingwood.

The loss followed a win and a tie in the previous two games.

MSS limited the strong Collingwood entry to a pair of first half touchdowns and mounted an excellent 65-yard drive on the arm of quarterback Andy Robinson as he found several

receivers to march to the Collingwood five yard line.

MSS ran out of time before it could cross the line for a major.

The second half saw tiring Midland players, many of whom played two ways, fall prey to a high-powered Collingwood attack.

A week earlier, the Marauders blanked Barrie Eastview 11-0 for their first victory of the season.

John Richardson's punt

in the first half forced Eastview to cough up a single point. The kick represented the only scoring of the first half.

Andrew Burgher, Jeff Warren and Chris Bezzo shut down Barrie's passing game and also came up with the big hits when their hosts attempted to run the ends. Ted Tobey and Rob Haley were strong at the corner linebacker position. Offensively, Midland

had difficulty moving the ball until the fourth quarter when Robinson spread out the defence with fine passing.

Richardson counted Midland's sole major from the fullback position complemented by Mike Dutton's running.

Richardson added a 35-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter to seal Barrie's fate.

Meanwhile, on Oct. 24

MSS tied Banting Memorial High School of Alliston 12-12.

Banting scored a pair of unconverted touchdowns in the first half to take a 12-0 lead into the fourth quarter.

Rob King, subbing for in-

jured quarterback Andy Robinson, tossed a pass to Brad Wadge for a 20-yard major.

With just 15 seconds remaining in the game, Robinson returned and bootlegged around the weak side to tie the game.

The single point attempt for the second win in a row was blocked by visiting Alliston.

The last contest of the season for the MSS Marauders will be Thursday at Barrie Central.

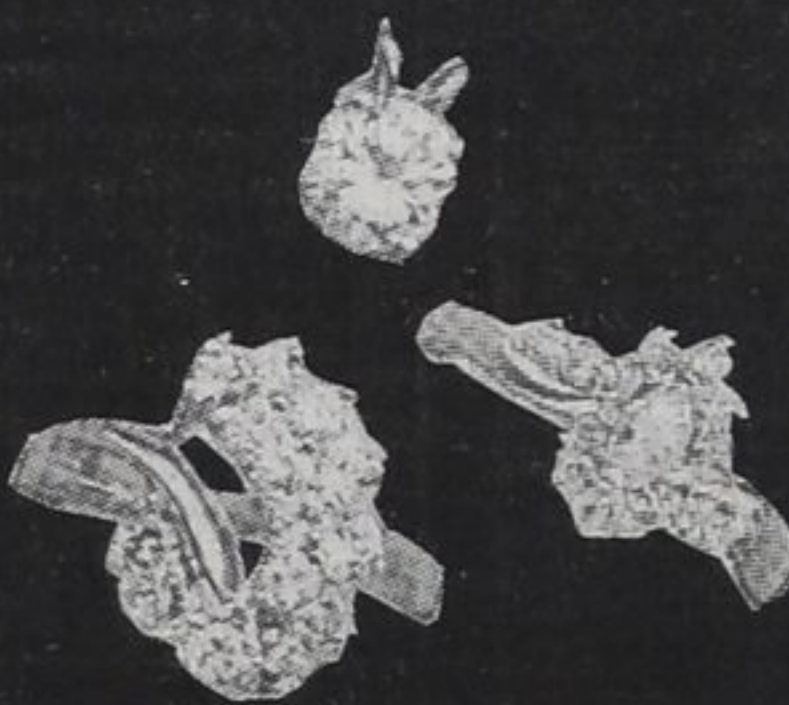
