

Cents make a triple-kill

The Stoneleigh Centennials enjoyed a successful weekend with three consecutive victories.

Friday night the Cents rocked Huntsville Blair McCanns 9-4 in Centennial Arena, defeated Innisfil 5-3 on the road Saturday and skated to a 5-3 victory over Parry Sound Brewers at Centennial Arena Sunday.

On Friday Midland led 2-0 on markers from newcomer Rob Fortin and Guy Jeannotte in the opening period only to have Huntsville tie the score. Mike Larmand counted twice within 90

seconds late in the period to put Midland ahead.

In the second period, the Cents' Trevor Irvine scored back-to-back tallies, the second with a man advantage.

Leading 6-3 entering the final 20 minutes against the league leaders, Midland had goals from Ted French and Dave Forrest before Huntsville tallied its final marker. Midland's Irvine completed his hat trick with 51 seconds left.

Saturday night in Innisfil, the Cents got goal production from five players, three on power plays.

Derek Haines counted

with a man advantage and Glen McDermott gave Midland a 2-0 lead at the 6:20 mark of the second period. The home town Bruins netted three in a row from Bill Farr, Dave Davies and Steve Varga for the lead.

But Midland netminder John Gibson shut down the Bruins in the third while his teammates pumped in a trio when Brad Wadge and Pat Marchand connected on power plays while John Richardson added a third in a span of two minutes 30 seconds.

Innisfil returns to Midland Friday at 8:30 p.m.

It is the second year in a row the Midland man received the honor.

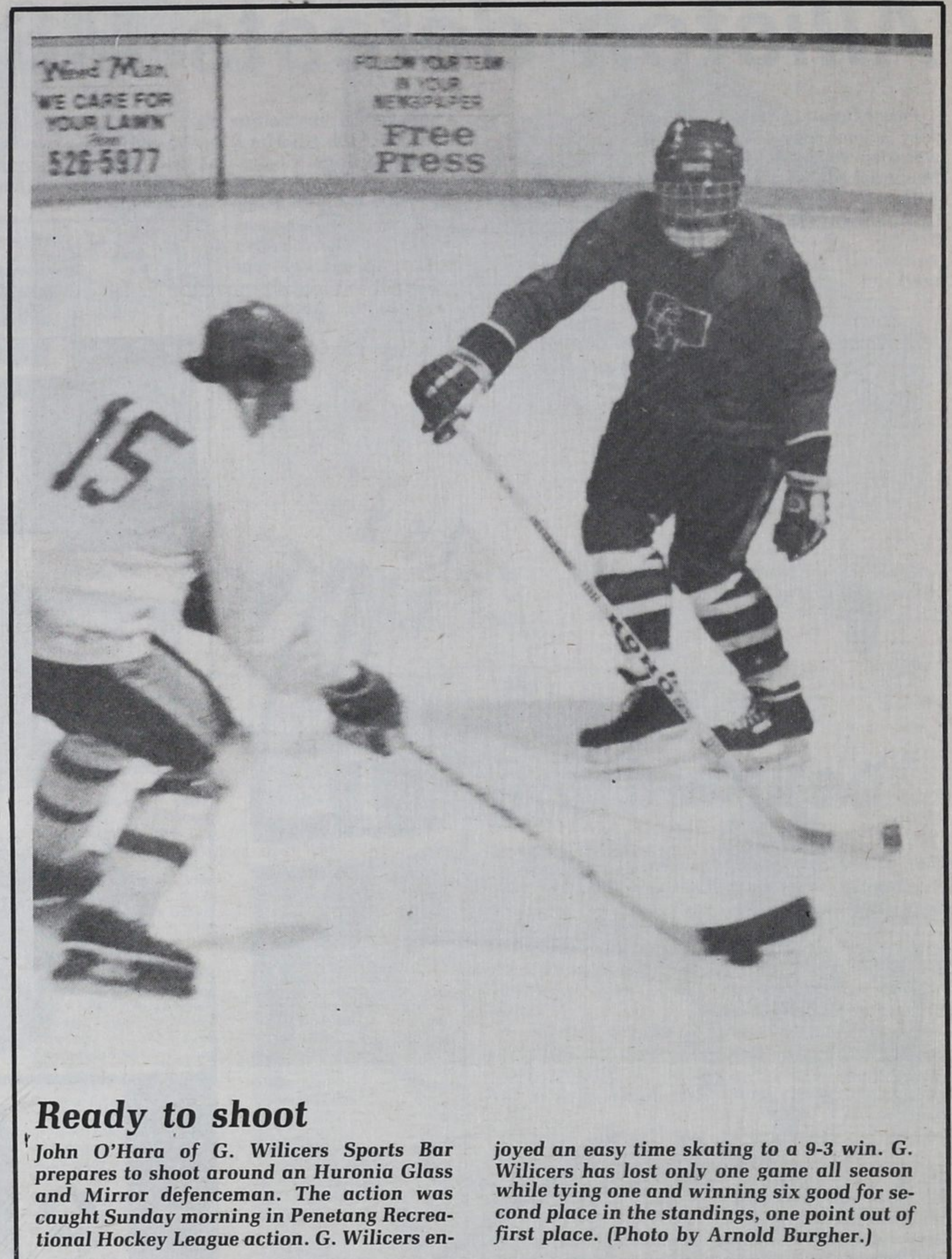
Meridis patrols left wing for the league-leading Laidlaws.
