Students hear veteran's tale

Remembrance Day ceremonies at Le Caron included an historical overview, poetry and a

dramatic tableau by the performing arts class.

The performance, using mime, tableaux and brief scenes, dramatized the dilemma of battle and the agonies of conscience facing each soldier.

Following two minutes of silence, teacher Michèle Boucher introduced Leo Lecamp, a war veteran from Penetang.

Lecamp spoke about leaving home at age 22 for Europe.

He described his five years of participation in

World War II, how he was wounded, about his friends and their deaths. He recounted a personal story about a bridge that was blown up. Years later he met a German soldier, who had been involved in the destruction of the bridge. He also noted that 25 years later, the man is a friend, not an enemy.

The ceremony ended with a reading of a poem by Bertolt Brecht and the singing of O Canada.

Despite increased difficulty of communicating

the reality of World War II to students, who have only known peace, Remembrance Day ceremonies continue to have an important affect on students today.

"War memories are very much alive for the persons who have known the war. The sharing of these memories help young people to become more conscious of war and peace in the world today," said Boucher.

The Remembrance Day service was organized by teacher Fran Emond.

Student honored

A Grade 13 Le Caron student has been honored for an outstanding performance in a youth leadership camp for student councils.

Yolande Moreau participated in the program sponsored by the Ministry of Education and offered in French.

French language secondary schools across the province took part in the four-day session at Lake Couchiching last month.
