The Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board on the 16th day of November, 1988 passed Bylaw Number 2002-88 to authorize the borrowing of money by the issue and sale of debentures of the said Board in the principal amount of \$1,300,000.

- 1. The purposes for which the money is to be borrowed is to construct Ecole Frere Andre, a new elementary school in the City of Barrie and the purchase of furniture and equipment therefore and to construct an addition to the Catholic Education Centre in the City of Barrie.
- 2. The amount to be borrowed is \$1,300,000 for 10 years on the security of the said debentures, which shall be a charge upon the schoolhouse property and premmises and any other real or personal property vested in the said Board and upon the separate school rates collectible by the said Board.
- 3. The debentures are to be dated the 15th day of December, 1988 and shall be payable in ten annual instalments of principal on the 15th day of December in each of the years 1989 to 1998, both inclusive, and shall bear interest payable semi-annually on June 15 and December 15 in each year. The debentures maturing in each of the years 1989 to 1993, both inclusive, shall bear interest at the rate of 103/4 per cent per annum and the debentures maturing in each of the years 1994 to 1998, both inclusive, shall bear interest at the rate of 11 1/8 per cent per annum. The amount payable annually for principal and interest shall be in approximately equal amounts of about \$223,400 for the years 1989 to 1993, both inclusive, and of about \$217,405 for the years 1994 to 1998, both inclusive.
