Good advice

Tay firefighters receive advice

Bob Widdes was promoted in November to deputy chief of the Tay township fire department. At the same time, two men became district chiefs: Mike Jones at Waubaushene No. 1 brigade, and Robert Herlichka at Old Fort No. 2 brigade.

Earlier this month, two new captains were appointed: Fred Potter at No. 1 station, and Ron Reeves at No. 2 station.

There's a new fulltime volunteer firefighter in Waubaushene: Mark Walker.

Chief Dan Moreau has some advice for a fire-safe holiday season.

"Christmas is usually a busy time for us," he commented. He said people can overload circuits and they may fail to water their Christmas tree or leave the tree lights on overnight.

He emphasized that the

burning of wrapping paper in wood stoves is a "no-no," because it can cause chimney fires. "The paper or cardboard that is necessary to start the fire is the only paper you should burn," he added.

No doubt everyone will be happier if the firemen have little to do this Christmas. As Widdes put it, "We're the only ones in business, when we're not working, people are happy."
