Smitten plans sports memorabilia and pictures throughout the establishment.

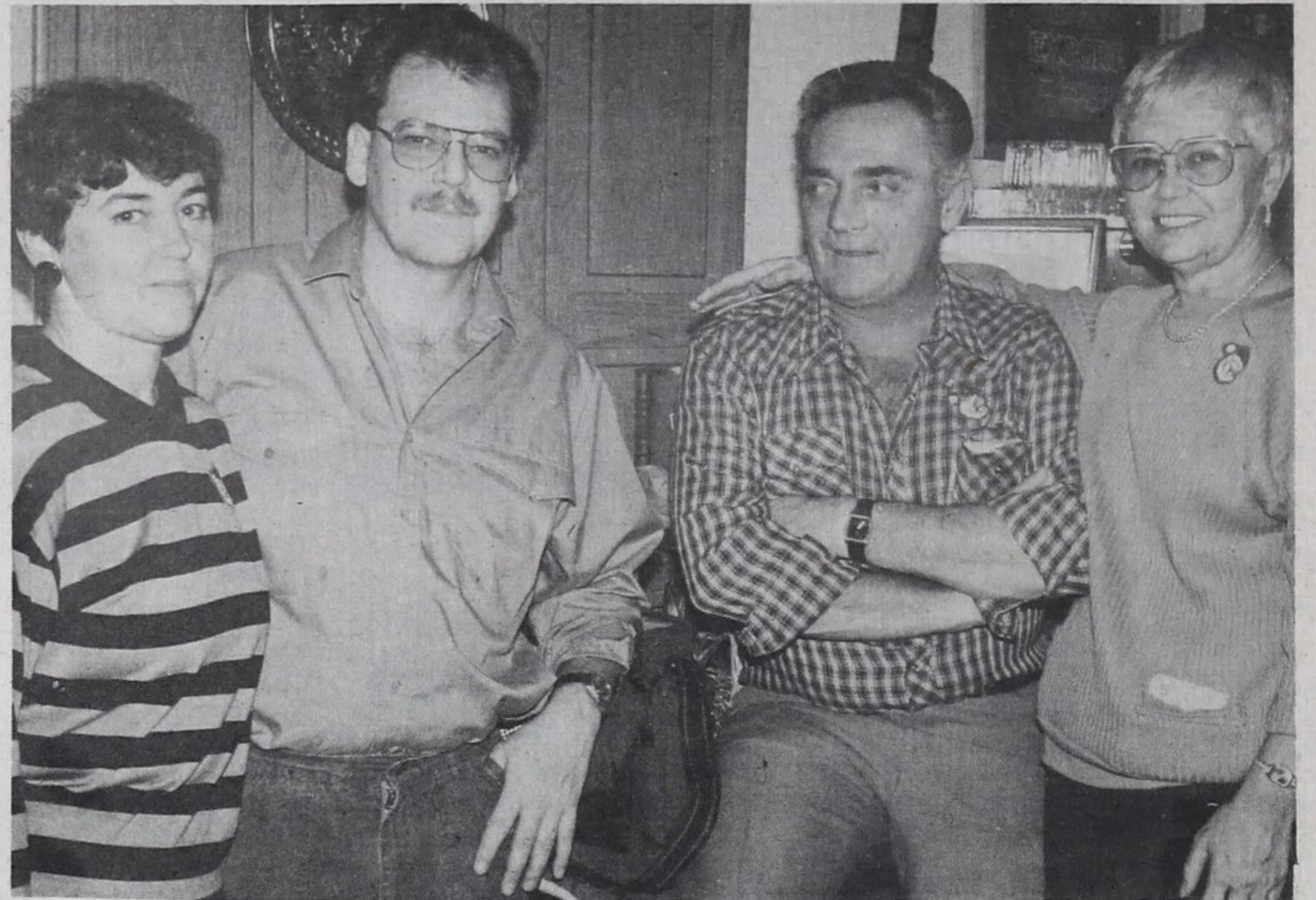
As for the restaurant menu, "Everything's the same," Smitten said. He will keep the Friday night
