scoring. Ted French opened the first frame for Midland Sunday night before David Thompson broke the ice for Innisfil with three minutes remaining in the first period. Richardson, Haines and Brad Wadge all found the range in the middle period for a 5-1 lead. Jim McLaren drilled a shot with a man advantage in the third after receiving passes from Ted French and Don Robertson. Mike Larmand scored on the power play at 15:52 with help from Marchand and Guy Jeannotte. Marchand counted his fourth point of the game with a goal less than a minute later assisted by Haines.

Midland's next game is in Penetang Jan. 13 at 8:30 p.m.

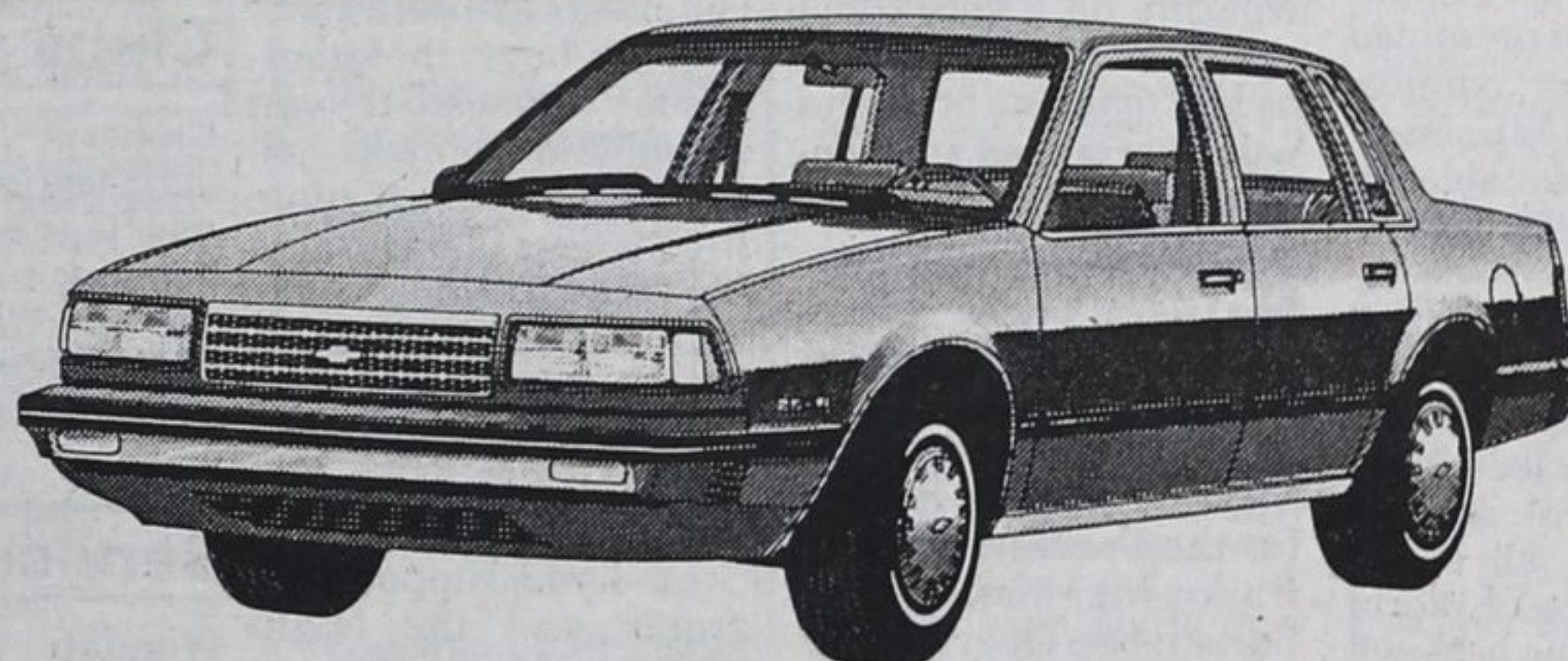
