

# Cardinal coming for 350th

Details of the celebration of the 350th anniversary of Sainte-Marie Among the Hurons are falling into place.

Archbishop Emmett Cardinal Carter of Toronto will take part June 21 in public ceremonies and

presentations at Sainte-Marie.

June 21 is the anniversary of the commemorative opening, in 1926, of the nearby Martyrs' Shrine.

On Easter Sunday, March 26, represen-

tatives of Martyrs' Shrine and the federal government will participate in public ceremonies and special presentations at Sainte-Marie.

Next Monday and Tuesday a delegation of management and staff

from Sainte-Marie will meet for a second time with Quebec provincial government officials.

Among items to be discussed will be a canoe trip to Sainte-Marie from Quebec City, similar to Destination: Sainte-Marie

of 1982; educational awards for students from Ontario and Quebec; and discussion of arranging co-ordinator for descendants of Sainte-Marie donees to visit Sainte-Marie in July.

Of the estimated 5,000 descendants of the donees, or helpers, of the

Jesuits living in Quebec, 1,700 have been "tracked," 350th anniversary co-ordinator Rob LaMarre says.

A co-ordinator for the canoe trip is expected to begin work by Jan. 31.

As part of Shonnecti this year, on Aug. 7, a

heritage flotilla of canoes will arrive at Sainte-Marie.

The public will be invited to take part on Sept. 26 in the meeting at Sainte-Marie of the Ontario Council of Bishops.

May 20 is opening day for the 1989 season.

## Midland-made movie opens

The movie Fireballs begins its local commercial theatre showing on Friday.

The low-budget movie can claim a feature no other commercial movie can claim: It was filmed entirely in, and on the

outskirts of, Midland.

Producer Mike Strapko brought a cast of actors and a crew to Midland in 1987. The comedy was filmed with the co-operation of the Town of Midland.

Michael Strapko and

his brother, David, were responsible for the filming in 1985 in Midland and area of parts of another low budget comedy, Recruits.

Fireballs can be seen in the Pen 1 in Penetanguishene this Friday through the following

Thursday. The movie carries an R (restricted) rating. Fireballs follows the adventures of bungling firefighters.

During the filming, a movie ambulance was driven at high speed in Pete Petterson Park up a ramp, over a second vehicle, and into Midland Bay. A controlled explosion of the second vehicle was a part of the stunt.

Also for the film, a house on Vinden Street near the Midway Motel was burned.

Mike Strapko co-wrote the script and acted in Fireballs. His parents live in Midland.
