The figure skating show held Sunday afternoon gave a great outlet for young local talent to show their stuff in front of large crowds filling the Midland arena.



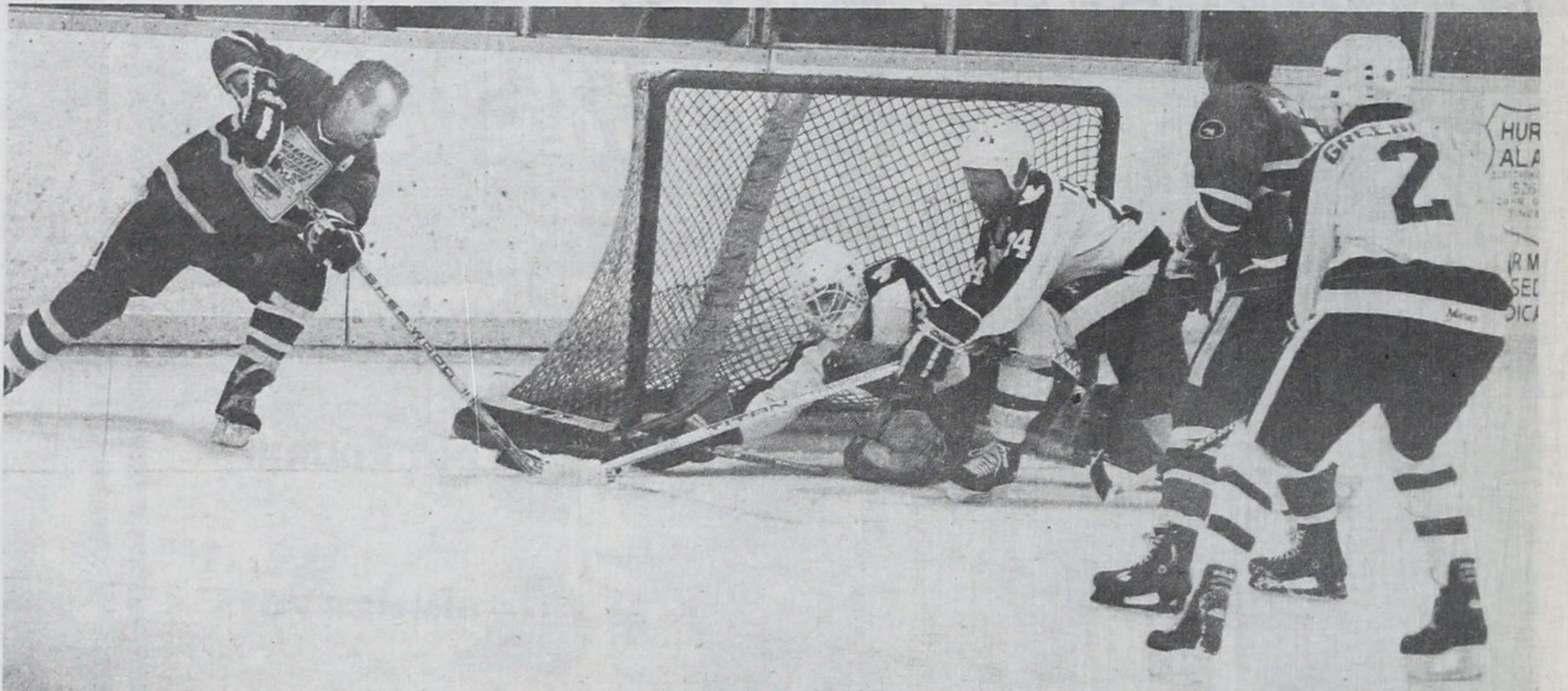
Waiting patiently

Saturday afternoon at the Wye Marsh in Midland children had the opportunity to snowshoe through the grounds and feed the chickadees.



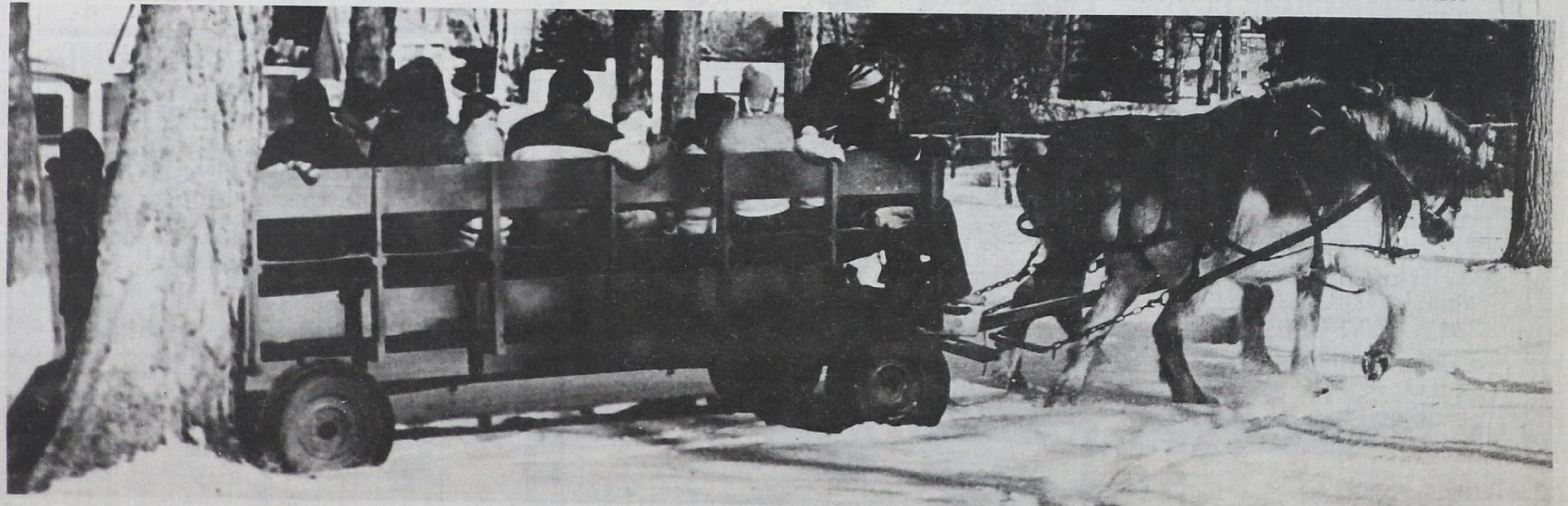
Snowmen
