Values begins

A social values volunteer program at the Oak Ridge division of the Mental Health Centre in Penetang has finally gotten off the ground.

The program had been scheduled to begin three times earlier, but was

delayed due to a lack of volunteers to work with patients.

Professor Donald Andrews, an expert on the subject of the positive effects of interaction between people in society and mental health patients, said he was optimistic about the program's success.

"There is a very active volunteer program here which has worked well before. We've got enough now (six volunteers) and they all look like they'll be staying."

The program is expected to run 3-5 weeks with weekly evening sessions that are an hour long.

Andrews said the patients at the Oak Ridge division are enthusiastic about taking part, but were concerned at first about the scheduling.

"The major concern was that it might interfere with the social/recreational programs that they're in right now."

That misunderstanding was cleared up and the program has gone well so far, said Jay Jelinek, a coordinator at the centre.

In fact, the organizers said the program adds to the social program due to the interaction and discussions that take place between the two groups.

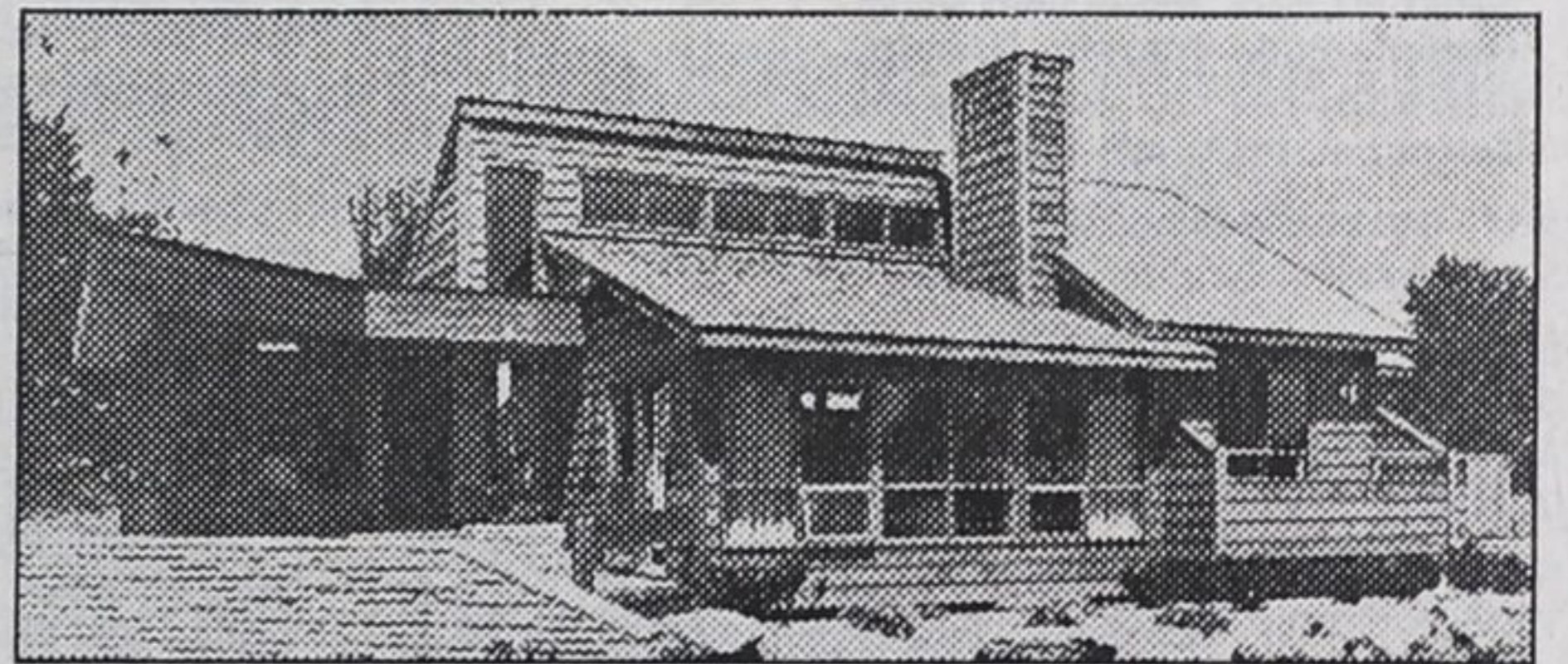
