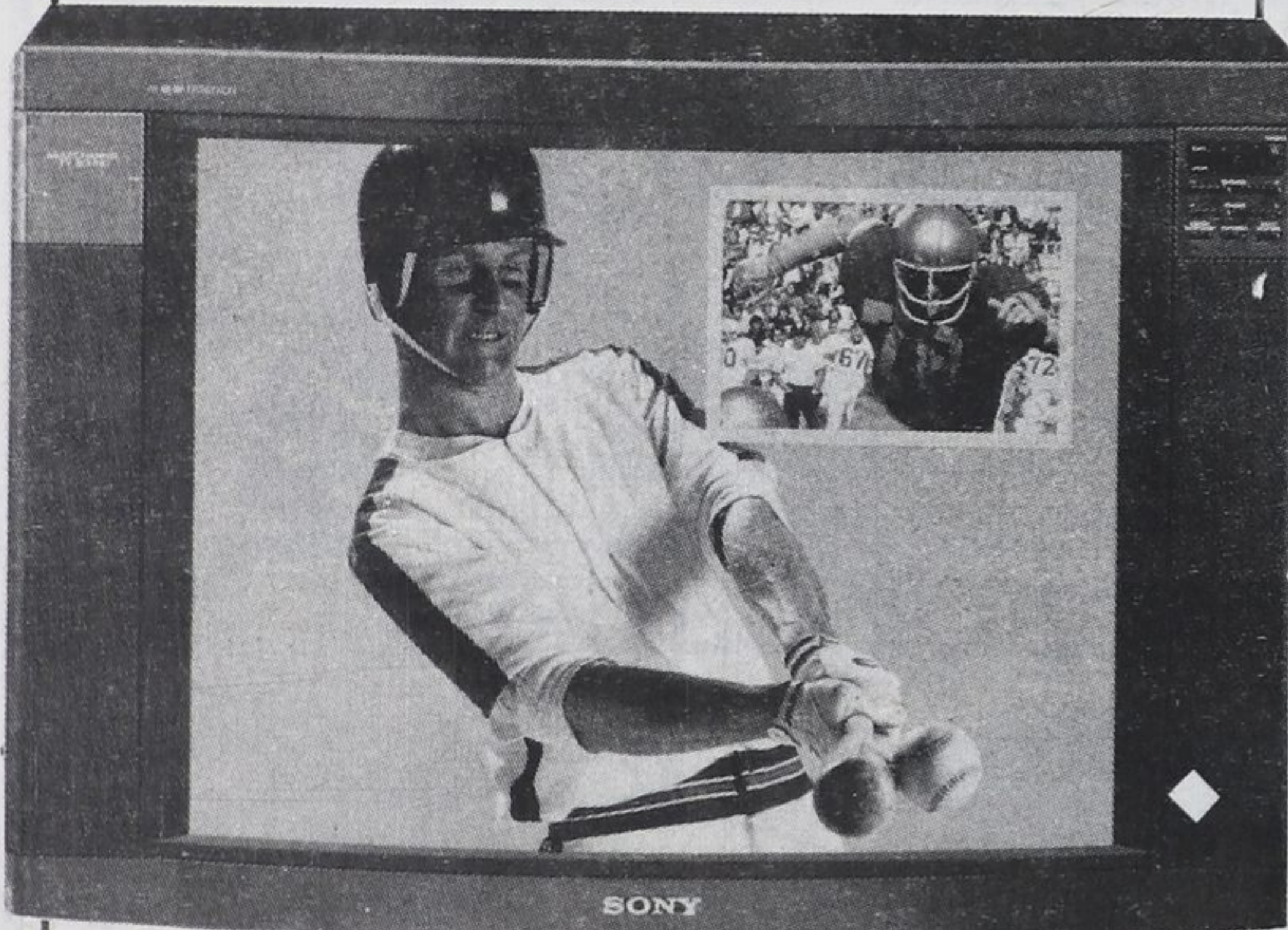

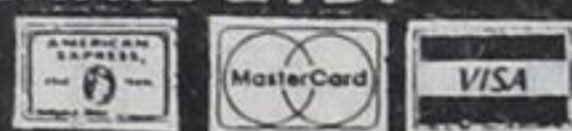

## Lewis predicts changes to Young Offenders Act may be on the horizon

Doug Lewis, Canada's justice minister and MP for Simcoe North, said changes to the Young Offenders Act may soon be in the works.

Lewis made the comment at Penetang Secondary School during a question period Monday after a student asked him about the Feb. 3 killing of Krista Sepp in a Midland group home for teenagers.

Lewis said he wouldn't comment directly on the case since it's now before the courts, but admitted changes to the act may be in the works.

"We'll (justice ministry) consider changes to the Young Offenders Act in light of what happened in Midland."

He said the problem was two-fold, being the penalties involved and the ability to administer

justice. "We have the power as the federal justice system over the penalties that can be handed down. The question now is whether three years for murder is warranted."

Lewis was referring to a case where a young man murdered a family three years ago and was recently released.

"There is also the question of young people under 12. Law enforcement groups have criticized that there is no legal way of covering this group. There is a case to be made about the handling (by law) of people under 12."

Lewis said his visit to ESPSS was just part of his usual commitment to visit his constituents when possible.

"I always come back whenever Parliament isn't sitting. I also have the reputation of being the fastest MP out of Ottawa on a Friday."
