Accused shooter appears

The youth charged with attempting to murder Constable Clement "Clem" Quesnelle and three others on Feb. 19 will appear in Midland Provincial Court on April 3.

The youth appeared in Midland Provincial Court for the first time on March 13.

A date for his trial must be set.

Lottery tickets recovered

A large quantity of lottery tickets, worth approximately \$9,000, stolen last Saturday evening from the lottery kiosk in Mountainview Mall, have been recovered.

Three local youths, two age 15 and one age 14, have been charged with theft over \$1,000.

Midland town police arrested one of the youths

in Midland on Monday for the Midland OPP.

Two charged with fraud

A Midland and an Orillia resident are charged with eight counts of fraud in connection with the passing of bad cheques to local businesses.

Stephen Glazebrook, 31, of Midland, and Sharon Lee Taylor, 25, of Orillia, were charged following a two-week-long investigation by the Midland OPP.

The OPP investigation continues.

Moving roadblock stops fleeing driver

A moving roadblock of three OPP cruisers forced a driver to stop on Highway 69 on March 10.

A Midland detachment and a Bala detachment cruiser in front and a Midland detachment

cruiser behind a car whose driver refused to stop, slowed the driver's car and forced it into a snowbank.

Podney Alan Wood, 32, of Weston, was charged with possession of stolen property, dangerous driving, impaired driving, driving over 80 milligrams, failing to stop for police, and driving while his licence was disqualified.

One of the two Midland OPP constables attempted to stop the driver believing that the car was stolen.

The driver refused to stop. The moving roadblock was used then to stop the car at 1:30 a.m.

Youth must pay

A youth attending Midland Secondary School has been ordered to pay \$500 to the Town of Midland.

The youth set off a false fire alarm at the school.

The court was provided with \$2,037.56 by Fire Chief Hal Belfry as the cost of the fire department responding to the alarm.

Last December a Midland adult was ordered to pay to the Town of Midland \$2,232.37 for falsely reporting in the middle of the night that a floor of an apartment building was on fire.

Tay rebuilds truck

It wasn't quite planned, but during the winter, Tay Township managed to get one of its trucks rebuilt.

Reeve Bruce Tinney noted a series of expenditures for "No. 6" while going over the roads account at council meeting.

He noted they added up to "big dollars." In fact, they totalled over \$6,000.

superintendent Cecil told the tale:

The driver of "No. 6," a sand truck, heard a strange noise one day.

The truck went in for repairs.

Soon after it came back, the noise started again.

Back it went for repairs.

It went back on the road and soon started making its noise again.

This time it received an engine overhaul.

Back on the road, the truck still had its noise habit.

The driver checked the left front wheel. The lugs were shifting - and making the noise that he'd heard all along.

Councillor Lynn Morton remarked ruefully, "Now we have a rebuilt truck."
