

Major Atoms just miss finals

Midland French Dry Cleaners Major Atoms were one win and two goals away from an appearance in the finals of the Golden Puck Hockey Tournament in Port Colborne on the weekend.

In the first three contests, Midland had just one goal scored against them while potting eight. In the semi-final fixture, Midland saw its goals against double losing 1-0 to Fort Erie.

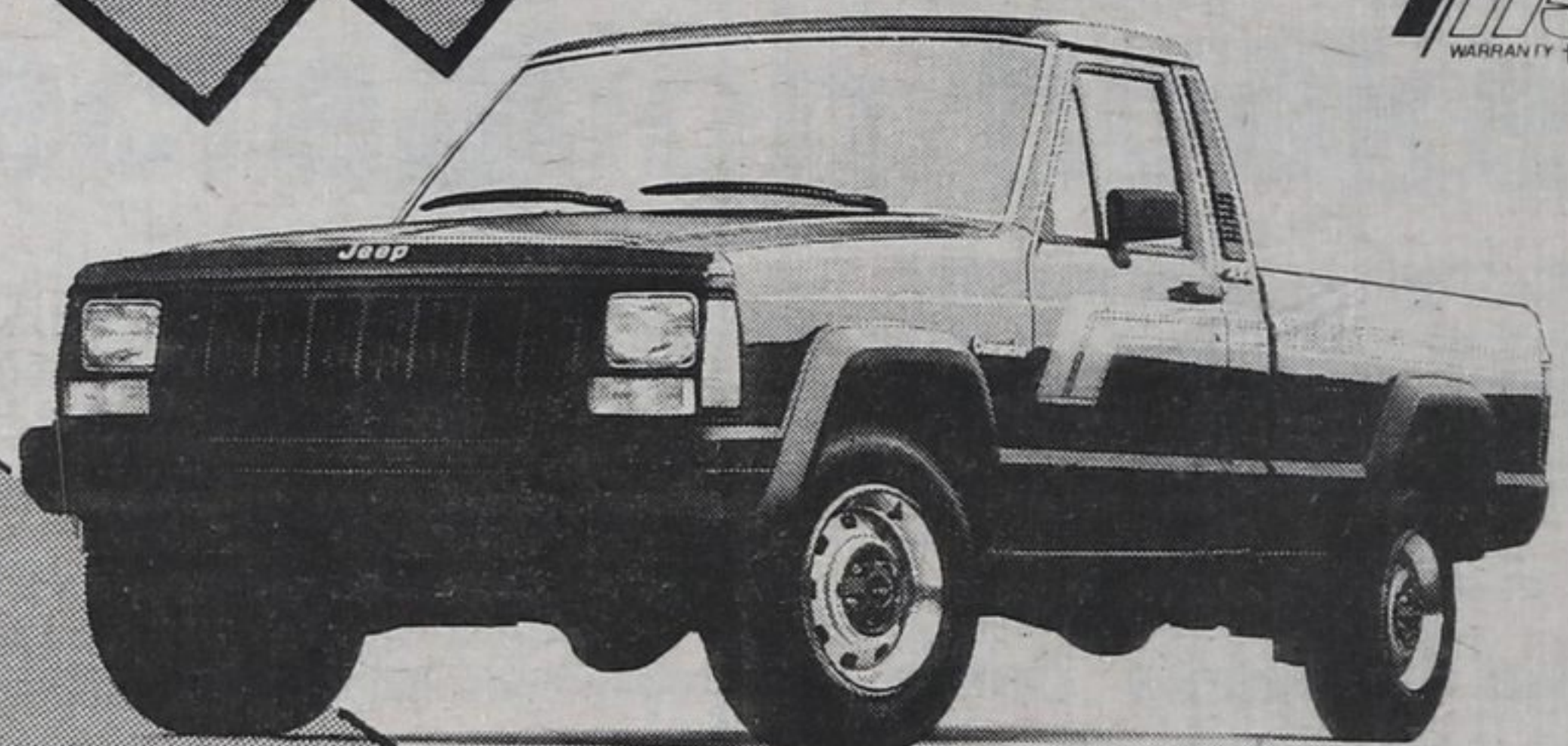
