The Paul Talbot coached Port McNicoll Public School junior girls won the fifth annual Huron Park Invitational Basketball Tournament Wednesday afternoon at Midland Secondary School.

Port defeated Monsignor Castex 39 - 36 in a repeat of last year's final.

Port opened the tourney with a 42 - 37 win over St. Joseph before downing Parkview 25 - 16. It finished the round robin with a 46 - 32 vic-

tory over Regent.

Meanwhile, Monsignor Castex were flying with wins over Huron Park (43 - 7), St. Joseph (31 - 27) and Parkview (45 - 24).

Other round robin scores were Parkview 29 Regent 21, Huron Park 38 Regent 25 and St. Joseph 55 Huron Park 30.

Parkview edged St. Joseph 36 - 34 to take the "B" title while Regent squeaked past Huron Park 31 - 30 for the "C" division honors.

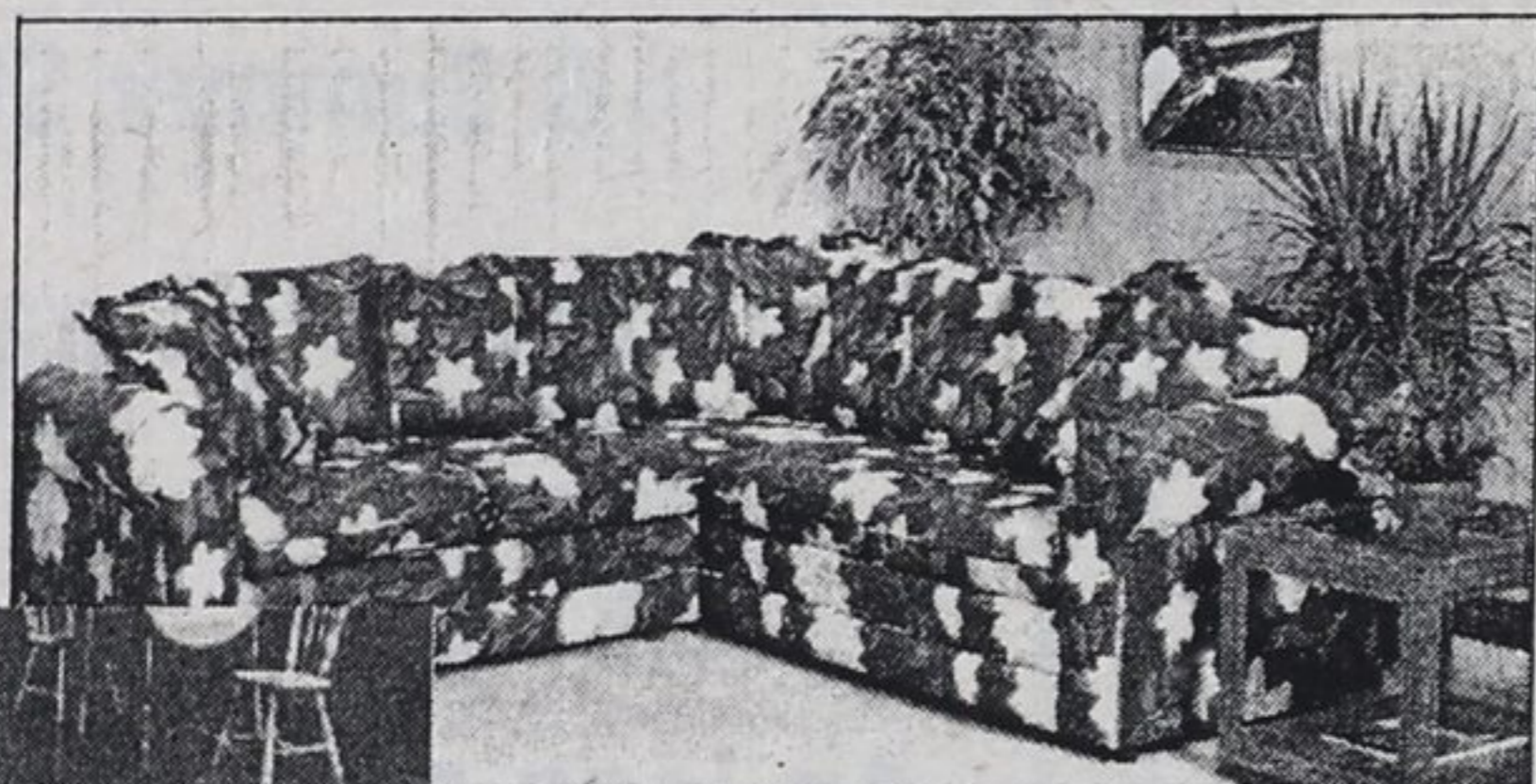

Midland regained its form Saturday night to blank KRS Rental of Orillia 5 - 0.

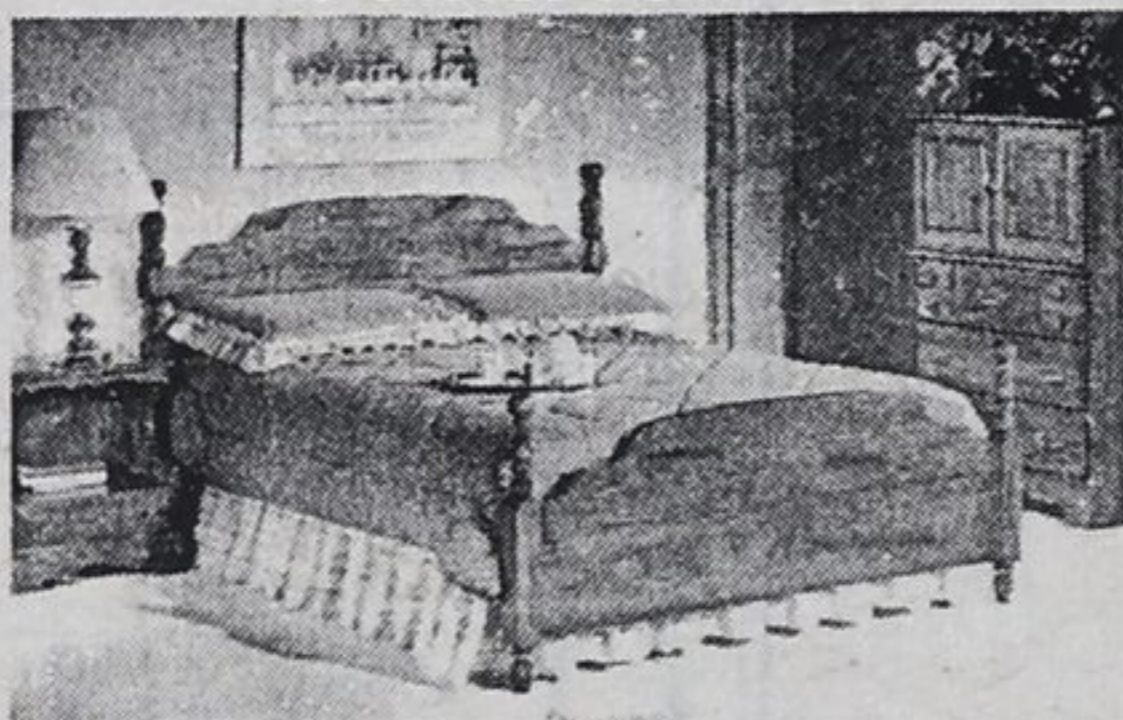
In the "C" division final Sunday afternoon, Midland was doubled 4 - 2 by Orillia's XKL.

Get On The Right Wavelength

If you own a commercial vessel, including a fishing vessel, 20 metres (65 feet) or more in length, please make sure that you're on our wavelength: 406 MHz.

The 406 MHz Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB), a technological innovation that could save your life, is the fastest and most precise location device on the market.



When activated in an emergency, the 406 MHz EPIRB emits a specially coded signal allowing us to pinpoint your location at sea within a range of two kilometres.

In addition, this signal allows us to identify your vessel — thanks to the registration card you filed with us when you got your EPIRB. We'll know the type of vessel we're looking for, as well as the number of crew members.

Within moments of receiving your EPIRB signal, we can

begin to implement the appropriate rescue procedure.

Remember: All Canadian commercial vessels over 20 metres (65 feet) in length must conform to the new regulation by having a 406 MHz EPIRB on board by May 31st, 1989*.

For information on how to acquire and register an EPIRB as soon as possible, please contact your nearest Canadian Coast Guard office.

Vessels now carrying an EPIRB or similar apparatus operating on the frequencies 121.5 MHz and 243 MHz are exempt from carrying the 406 MHz EPIRB for four years, as of May 31st, 1989.
