Herbert Ogden

Bayfort Camp, Midland, operator Herbert Ogden died in Huronia District Hospital Feb. 19, after two weeks' illness. He was 88.

Herb Ogden was a tourist camp operator from 1945 until his death. Between 1932 and 1945 he worked at Dominion Foundry and Steel in Hamilton.

The Imperial Army infantryman served in Germany and Ireland. He was a member of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 545, Port McNicoll.

Ogden was born in Oldham, Lancashire, England, to Joseph Ogden and Mary Jane Person.

His sons Ernest Ogden and Joseph Edgar Ogden survive. His wife, Edith Ogden, and his sister Alice Binns of England, predeceased him.

Rev. Al Farthing officiated at the funeral service held Feb. 22 in Nicholls Funeral Home. A Legion service was held Feb. 21.
