MEETING OF THE COUNTY MAGISTRATES.

From the Leader. A special general session of the United Counties of York and Peel was held in the Court House in this city on Tuesday.

The motion was unanimously adopted. SEPARATION OF THE COUNTIES FROM THE CITY.

W. Tyrell, Esq., then offered the following resolution: 'That it is essentially necessary for the interest of the United Counties of York and Peel that they should be at once separated from the city of Toronto for judicial purposes.'

PAYMENT OF CRIMINAL WITNESSES. On motion of Dr. Norris, it was ordered that a committee, consisting of the Warden, James Beachell, Esq., Col. Berford, John Lynch, Esq., and the mover, be appointed to memorialize the Attorney General or Legislature, praying for some legislative enactment authorizing the payment of criminal witnesses in all cases in Upper Canada, and that the committee also request the representatives of the counties to support such a measure, should it be introduced into the House of Assembly.

Dr. Norris then moved the following resolution, seconded by Rice Lewis, Esq., 'That a committee be named to memorialize the Attorney General or petition the Legislature, praying that some enactment be made authorizing justices of the peace to commit to the common jail, with hard labor, for a term not exceeding one month, any person, being alone wholly or in part, lam or herself, to maintain his or her family, by work or other means, and willfully refusing to do so, by which refusal or neglect he or she, or any of his or her family whom he or she may be legally bound to maintain, shall be left destitute or in want; and any person leaving his wife or his child or children without any or at all adequate means of support.'

Dr. Norris moved that the limits of divisions one and two of the Division Court of the United Counties be altered by constituting the township of Scarborough a separate division to be numbered 12. The motion gave rise to some debate, but was eventually carried.

SAFETY OF THE AUSTRALASIA. The most interesting piece of intelligence brought by the Arabia is the cheering news that the mail steamer Australasian, of the Cunard line, about which serious apprehensions in respect to her safety were entertained for the past week, is safe. It appears that the Australasian left Liverpool on the 16th of February, her regular day of sailing, received her mails, and proceeded on her way, calling at Cork harbour. On the 18th she experienced light, variable winds, and on the following day there was a strong breeze and a heavy sea, rendering it very difficult to manage the ship.

As soon as the accident was discovered Capt. Hockley immediately hoisted sail and directed the course of his vessel westward with the intention of making an American port. For seven days she passed through heavy squalls, which culminated on the 26th February in a fierce gale and furious squalls, rendering it almost impossible to manage the ship. The commander succeeded in putting her head round in latitude 40 24' north and longitude 34 20' west, and bore up for Queenstown, arriving with his passengers and crew all safe, on the morning of the 3rd of March, after a rough voyage of twenty-six days duration. When the Arabia called at Cork, on her outward-bound voyage she took the Australasian's passengers on board, arrived yesterday morning. The passengers of the disabled steamer speak in the highest terms of the kindness manifested by the captain and officers of the Arabia.
