

DISASTROUS FIRE ON SUNDAY MORNING.

Elm Street Methodist Church Burned Down.

\$25,000 WORTH OF PROPERTY DESTROYED.

(From the Globe.) One of the most disastrous fires which has occurred in Toronto for a lengthened period took place yesterday morning on Elm-street, and we regret to state, resulted in the total destruction of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, three houses, and a large quantity of other property.

A short time ago. The building was valued from \$3,500 to \$4,000. He also lost a valuable horse, carriage, sleigh, and a quantity of harness. The total amount of property destroyed could not be worth less than twenty-five thousand dollars.

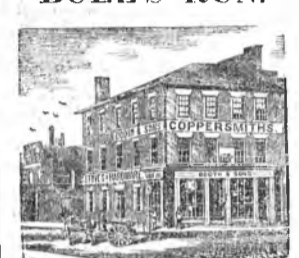

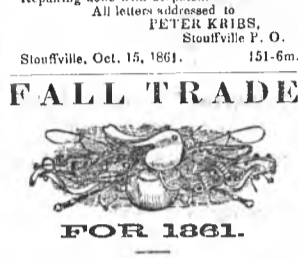
