Tessel. NARROW ESCAPE BY A JUDGE .- The Dublin correspondent of the Tenes says: —The County of Tipperary certainly con-tains some of the most darmg rulians in the world. An outrage which for cool andacity surpasses even the conduct of Hayes who murdered Mr. Braddell, occurred at the Tipperary Quarter Sessions on Friday, when Mr Sergeaut Howley, the respected chairman of the county, was respected charman of the county, was very near being wounded on the Bencin, where he sat surrounded by twelve magis-trates. There were two silpendlary magistrates and thirty constables, present, and the court house was densely crowded. A young man about 22 years of age, named Richard Carey, was indicted for stealing two shirts. He paid no attention to the writemen and ascended out or prefuse. The evidence and seemed quite reckless. The jury found ion Guilty, and it having been asertained that he had been imprisoned before at Cashel as a deserter, he was sentenced to three months' imprisonment with hard labor. The moment the seatence was pronounced the prisoner made a sid-den movement, and flung a stone of a pound weight at the head of the judge. Providentially he read not taken his eyes off the prisoner, and, perceiving the sud-den action, he threw himself back from the chair and thus avoided the blow. The violence with which it was thrown smashed violence with which it was thrown smaxued the stone, and a portion of it remained in the wordwork behind the chair. The greatest constention was exected by this during outrage. The magistrates held a consultation, and resolved to have the prisoner indicted and tared for his offence at the next assizes. The learned judge was warmly congratu'ated by his friends on his almost miraculous escape.


