MANURES --- PRESERVATION

Horse manure is one of the most nergetic of the animal manures, and is very easily injured; in fact without care to give proper treatment, most of that made in summer will be about rained. Bousingault found that when horse dung was allowed to be thoroughly decomposed it jost nine-tenths of its weight and more than half of its value. This is not the effects of burning but perfect decomposition. Where, when the manure is burned in a heap it is little better than askes. This can be prevented by the application of water to the manure heap, for quent turnings and making compact piles, but this is attended with a good deal of trouble, and few have water in sufficient quantities of wenter.
