

THE EXODUS FROM IRELAND.—The *Limerick Chronicle* says: "The exodus of young men of the farming class to America is really astonishing. Every week for the last two months the drain has been constantly increasing. It is useless to insinuate that the American Government has the least hand in thus draining the country of its 'bone and sinew,' for we have seen several letters from the friends and relations of those who started, or are about to start, describing the necessities of the demand for labour, and the punctual payment thereof in the currency of the country; also their perfect security from all peremptory laws. For, as long as they remain from swearing away their allegiance to Britain, they can claim their protection with impunity." A correspondent of the *Cork Examiner*, writing from Mitchelstown, says: "This town was lately visited by a Yankee gent having all the airs of a military man. In a speech which he made he told the people that he was prepared to give any young man able to work, a passage from Queenstown to New York for three pence, with a certainty of good employment when they arrived there. He got names and money from over five hundred young men." The *Cork Constitution* states that two American agents paid a visit to Charleville lately. They came by the Dublin train, and brought with them a number of persons whom they had enlisted for the construction of a railway in America. They wanted others, however, and they thought that Charleville might furnish them. To the people whom attendance at market had brought into town they accordingly addressed themselves, presenting most promising prospects, and offering most seducing wages. The thoughtless listeners were soon caught, and were ready to at once engage for embarkation. However, Mr. Clancy, D.L., hearing of it, went to the parish priest (Mr. Leader), who accompanied him to the scene of operations, told the people that it was not for a railway, but for the emigrants. He wanted them, and informed the latter that if they did not decamp they would be given in charge of the police. They took the hint, and fifty persons whom they had engaged thus fortunately escaped. The *Cork Examiner* states that the party who represented himself as an agent, empowered to engage a large number of labourers in that country to complete some unfinished line of railways, and who offered the intending emigrants a passage to America on the payment of three pence, turned out to be a swindler, and had decamped.

FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT.—About half-past six o'clock yesterday morning a melancholy accident occurred on the Grand Trunk Railway, whereby a young man named Chas. Jackson lost his life. It appears that the deceased, who was a brakeman, attempted to get upon Engine No. 11 while it was in motion, opposite Messrs. Gooderham and Worts' mills, and in the effort his leg and thigh were badly crushed between it and the tender. He was taken to the hospital soon after the sad occurrence, when Dr. Aikins was summoned to attend to his injuries. Having held a consultation with Dr. Gardner, that gentleman decided not to amputate the injured limb, it being apparent that if young man would die if the operation was attempted. The medical men were not in their opinion as to the effect of the injuries sustained by the unfortunate youth, for he died about an hour subsequently. Dr. Hallowell opened an inquest on the body, and then adjourned till to-day in order that he might obtain the evidence of the engine driver, who was not present at the inquest yesterday.—*Leader of Wednesday.*

BURGLARY.—A daring burglary was committed on the jewellery store of Mr. Robt. Wilkes, Yonge street, either on Saturday or Sunday night. The burglars must have used false keys to effect an entrance into the building. Some two hundred dollars worth of jewellery and pocket cutlery was carried off by the robbers. The front door was carefully closed before they left, in order to prevent suspicion, and the robbers then took their departure through a window in the rear part of the store. An attempt was made to open the safe, but, fortunately, without effect. It is suspected that the burglary was committed by some parties who accompanied the circus, not as actors, but as pickpockets and thieves. Two or three suspicious looking men were observed in Mr. Wilkes' store on Saturday afternoon, and one of them purchased a few trilling articles. No doubt they were inspecting the premises with a view to future operations. The police are engaged in investigating the matter, but have not as yet found any trace of the missing property.—*Leader.*
