## News in Brief.

An announcement is made that the Pope has seriously under consideration the propriety of canonizing Christopher Columbus, as the instrument chosen by Heaven for the salvation of a whole hemisphere.

THE TRIAL OF CONSTANCE KENT.-Mr Karslake, Queen's counsel, and Mr H. Lopes, both of the western circuit, have been retained by the crown to conduct the prosecution of constance Kent, at the approaching Wilts Assize. Mr. Eldin has been retained for the defence.

SUBSCRIPTION FOR GENERAL LEE.—The New York correspondent of the Morning Herald says:—' It is understood that a subscription is being pushed in Baltimore for the benefit of General Lee, and that some 40,000 dollars have already been collected. General Lee, it will be remembered, has lost everything in the war. His splendid estates at Arlington were confiscated and sold to Northerners at an early period in the struggle and his property elsewhere in the South or in Virginia (I think he had no property outside of his native State) is, of course, claimed by the Federal Government.

THE ATLANTIC CABLE.—According to present arrangements the Great Eastern will start with the Atlantic cable on July 5th. With her will also sail her Magesty's ship Terrible, and another paddle steam frigate of great power, not yet chosen, but which, like the Terrible, will give towing aid to the Great Eastern in case of mishaps to her machinery, either screw or Paddle. In addition to Captain Auderson, all the officers Remaining in the Richmond Hill Pos Office, on 1st June, 1865: of the chief engineer have been chosen from the Cunard service. With ordinary fair Baker, Jonathan weather, and staming at the rate of six knots, to the bay of Hearts' Content, in Newfoundland, will occupy from 12 to 14 days, during every hour of which regular communication will be kept up with England.

Pirates on the Irish Coast.—A letter from Wesport, under date of May 26, says: -'Captain Cumming, of the schooner Elizaboth Maclure, of Grivan, arrived here yesterday from Liverpool, reports that at ten P.M. on Tuesday the 22d inst., while the vessel was lying becalmed off the Island of Inniskae, saw sixteen canoes and one boat coming off. The united crew numbered about fifty men, who boarded the vessel, and took from eighteen to twenty tons of cargo (maize) out of her, as well as ropes and many other lose articles. They formed on deck, at the same Time threatning, if resisted, they would cut away the masts. They remained on board till one o, clock next morning, when they left.
