VENTILATION .- Some interesting experiments have been made at Cherbourg. in the presence of a government commission, on a new system of faciliating respiration in the noxious atmosphere of wells and mines. The inventor's name is Galibert. One form of this apparatu. is a reservoir containing 110 litres of atmospheric air, to which two tubes are adapted. These tubes are fixed in a piece of horn, which is placed between the teeth. The operator straps the reservoir on his back, stops his nostrils with an in-Richmond Hill, June, 1845. strument provided for the purpose, pro tects his eyes with closely-fitting specta cles, and breathes as slowly and quietly as possible through two tubes There another variety of the apperatus, in which the reservoir is dispensed with, and the ends of the tubes are left in the open air but with this no exploration deeper than 15 ci 20 metres can be made.
