MUNICIPALITY OF VAUGHAN!

THE Assessor for the Township of Vaughan will forthwith proceed to carry out the provisions of the Act of Parliament, passed during the last Session, for the

Taxing of Dogs. The attention of the public is hereby called to the accompanying Extract from the said Act.

By order of the Council, G. J. F. PEARCE, Clerk.

EXTRACT

An Act to impose a tax on Dogs, and to provide for the better protection of Sheep in Upper Canada.

Her Majesty, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Taxes imposed on Dogs in U. C. 1. There shall be levied annually in every Municipality in Upper Canada, upon the owner of each Dog therein, an annual tax of one dollar for such animal.

Assessors to ascertain Owners of Dogs and amount of Taxes. 2. The assessors of every Municipality, at the time of making their Annual Assessments, shall ascertain the number of dogs liable to be taxed, and shall enter in lists to be made by them, the name of every person in their respective Municipalities then owning or keeping any dog subject to the above tax, the number of dogs kept by such person, and the whole amount of tax to be paid by him.

Owners to give the Required Information. Penalty for Default. 3. The owner or possessor of every dog liable to such tax, shall, when required by the assessors, deliver him a description, in writing, of every such dog owned or possessed by him, and for every neglect or refusal to do so, and for every false statement made in any description so furnished, such owner or possessor shall incur a penalty of five dollars to be recovered by the clerk of the municipality before any court of competent jurisdiction.

Moneys Collected to be a Fund for Paying Damages done by Dogs. 6. The moneys so collected and paid to the Clerk or Treasurer of any Municipality, shall constitute a fund for satisfying such damages as may arise in any year, from dogs killing or injuring sheep in such municipality and the residue, if any, shall form part of the assets of the municipality for the general purposes thereof.

Persons Harboring Dogs, to be deemed Owners thereof. 16. Every person in possession of any dog or who shall suffer any dog to remain about his house or premises for the space of twenty days previous to the assessment of a tax, or previous to any injury, chasing or worrying of sheep or any such attack made by such dog, shall be deemed the owner of such dog for all the purposes of this Act.
