Taxes imposed on Dogs in U. C. 1. There shall be levied annually in every Municipality in Upper Canada, upon the owner of each Dog therin, an annual tax of For Cuts, Cracked Heels, and all kinds of sores on Horses and Cattle. one dollar for such animal. Assessors to ascertain Owners of Dogs

and amount of Taxes. 2. The assessors of every Municipality, at the time of making their Annual Assessments, shall ascertain the number of dogs iable to be taxed, and shall enter in lists to he made by them, the name of every person in their respective Municipalities then own ing or keeping any dog subject to the above tax, the number of dogs kept by such person, and the whole amount of tax to be paid by him.

Owners to give the Required Information. Penalty for Default. 3. The owner or possessor of every dog liable to such tax, shall, when required by the assessors, deliver him a description, in writing, of every such dog owned or possessed by him, and for every neglect or refusal to do so, and for every false statement made in any description so furnished, such owner or possessor shall incur a penalty of five dolars, to be recovered by the clerk of the municipality before any court of competent iurisdiction. Moneys Collected to be a Fund for Pay-

ing Damages done by Dogs.

The moneys so collected and paid to the Clerk or Treasurer of any Municipality, shall constitute a fund for satisfying such damages as may arise in any year, from dogs killing or injuring sheep in such municipality TOR the Counties of York, Peel and Ontario.
