Awful Petrolum Fire in Antwerp.

A fire broke out in the City of Antwerp, on Friday morning, the 10th inst., and up to the latest advices in London was still raging tremendously.

The extent of property in buildings and merchandise at present consumed is roughly calculated at £200,000 to £300,000. The fire broke out at about 7 o'clock on Friday morning in some merchant's stores, situate in the Place de Walborge, a kind of square fronting the quay, and known as the commercial neighbourhood of Antwerp.

The fire then increased in magnitude tenfold and explosions that followed shook the whole city, and brought down many houses, while many people are reported, to have been killed. The force of the explosive blew in the brickwork of the sewers, into which the burning petroleum flowed, and by that means found its way into a good many houses in Rue de Sans, and in many other streets in the locality.

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THE INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

It is understood that an arrangement has been come to between the British Government and the Nova Scotia and New Brunswick Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Canadian Government and Legislature, on the details of the Confederation of British North America, and of the Imperial guarantee of the sum required by the Intercolonial Railway.

THE INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

This guarantee has been proposed successively by Lord Grey in 1851 by the Duke of Newcastle in his despatch of the 12 of April, 1852; and by Mr. Cardwell, in a despatch of the 17th of June, 1855; but it was made dependent on the assent of the Provinces to the Confederation, which Nova Scotia and New Brunswick had until now withheld, and also on further evidence that the sum of £3,000,000 originally stipulated for should suffice for the purpose.

THE INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

All the Provinces have now agreed to the Confederation, and it is said to have been conceded that a contingent fourth million shall, if found necessary, be further guaranteed, (Canada, however, having already constructed 120 miles of railway from Quebec to Trois Pistoles, and Nova Scotia 60 miles from Halifax to Truro, there remain but 36 miles to construct, and at the official estimate of \$7,000,000 will suffice. The primary guarantee to be given by the Provincial Legislatures in the following proportions:—five-twelfths by Canada, three and a half twelfths by New Brunswick, and the same proportion by Nova Scotia.
