Tribulation in Whiskeydom.

To the Editor of the York Herald.
Sir:—Believing that you desire to promote the cause of Temperance, permit me to trouble you with a few remarks upon a case that was brought before A. Law, Esq., J.P., last week...

Two of the Magistrates decided that the law had been grossly violated in Mr. Waterhouse's case, and inflicted a fine of Fifty Dollars, and costs, for his offence, in accordance with the Township By-Laws.

The thanks of the community are due to the Councilor, for the moral courage he has manifested in taking this matter in hand; it is one of those unpleasant duties that is frequently shirked by those who fear to brave the Whiskeyites...

Atlantic Telegraph Cable.

1st.—From any telegraph station in AMERICA to any telegraph station in GREAT BRITAIN OR IRELAND, TWENTY words or less, including address, date, and signature, not exceeding in all ONE HUNDRED letters, TWENTY pounds sterling or ONE HUNDRED dollars in gold...

2d.—From any telegraph station in AMERICA to any telegraph station in EUROPE an increase of ONE POUND STERLING or FIVE DOLLARS GOLD OVER THAT TO GREAT BRITAIN, on first TWENTY words, counted as above, and an increase over same of ONE SHILLING STERLING or TWENTY-FIVE CENTS for each additional word.

3d.—To any station in AFRICA, ASIA, or INDIA, an increase on the first TWENTY words of FIVE POUNDS STERLING or TWENTY FIVE DOLLARS, and on each additional word, of FIVE SHILLINGS STERLING or ONE DOLLAR TWENTY-FIVE CENTS GOLD ABOVE THE RATE TO GREAT BRITAIN.

4th.—The date, address, and signature will be counted with the first TWENTY words, and if the number of letters exceed one hundred, the excess will be divided by FIVE and each FIVE letters or fractional remainder thereof be charged for as additional words.

5th.—The letters in all words above TWENTY will be counted and divided by FIVE and each FIVE or sectional remainder be charged for as a word.

6th.—All messages in code or cipher will be charged double the foregoing rates, and all figures intended for transmission must be written in full length, and will be charged as words.

7th.—Special care is enjoined to have all Messages written on the Company's blanks or under the headings thereof.

8th.—Messages destined beyond the range of Telegraph, will be forwarded by Mail.

1st.—No Student of Medicine having been in regular attendance on Medical Lectures, in any Canadian University before the First day of May, 1867, shall be compelled to pass any other Matriculation examination, or pursue any other curriculum than such as was required at the time he commenced his attendance on such lectures.
